

THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 3968

A BY-LAW to amend By-law No. 3089 being the
"Burnaby Trades License By-law 1950".

The Municipal Council of The Corporation of the District
of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY TRADES LICENSE
BY-LAW 1950, AMENDMENT BY-LAW 1958".

2. Clause (e) of section 7 of By-law No. 3089 is repealed
and the following substituted therefor:

"(e). The fee payable in respect of any transfer of
license from one person to another shall be five percent of the
total fee for such license, provided that the minimum fee shall
be one dollar".

3. Schedule "A" is repealed and the following substituted:

Every person carrying on any trade, business, profession, or other occupation not hereinbefore enumerated in Part I or Part II shall pay every six months by the 15th day of January and the 15th day of July, a license fee in the amount of twenty dollars and no reduction shall be made on account of any person commencing or ceasing to carry on such trade, business, profession or other occupation at any particular time."
