THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 4067

A BY-LAW to regulate the use of firearms in the Municipality.

The Municipal Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

- 1. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY FIREARM REGULATION BY-LAW 1959."
- 2. No person shall discharge any firearm within the Municipality except as in this By-law provided.
- J. Upon obtaining the permission in writing of the Officer Commanding, Burnaby Detachment, Royal Canadian Mounted Police, any person may discharge firearms in that area of the Municipality more particularly defined as:

"Commencing at the intersection of Marine Drive with the westerly boundary of the Municipality; thence south and following the westerly boundary of the Municipality to the north bank of the north arm of the Fraser River;

thence southeasterly and northeasterly along the north bank of the north arm of the Fraser River to Meadow Avenue;

thence northwesterly along Meadow Avenue to 10th Avenue;

thence northeasterly along 10th Avenue to Marine Drive;

thence westerly along Marine Drive to the west boundary of the Municipality."

PROVIDED THAT no person shall discharge any firearm in the said area within 150 yards of any dwelling house, school house, church, workshop, or place of business, or of any highway or place where other persons may be assembled or engaged in work of any kind, or within the limits of any dedicated park site.

- 4. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to Police Officers acting in the execution of their duties, or to members of the Armed Forces or to members of gun clubs using ranges approved by the Municipal Council, or to persons authorized by the Game Act to discharge firearms.
- 5. By-law No. 3049 is repealed.
