THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 4212

A BY-LAW to authorize the expropriation of certain real property.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary and in the public interest to expropriate the real property hereinafter described in order to widen Hastings Street in the Municipality of Burnaby and to construct and install therein necessary municipal works and services.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

- 1. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY HIGHWAY EXPROPRIATION BY-LAW NO. 5, 1960".
- 2. In order to widen Hastings Street and to construct and install therein necessary municipal works and services, The Corporation of the District of Burnaby is hereby authorized and empowered, without the consent of the owners of the real property but subject to the provisions of Division (4) of Part XII of the Municipal Act:-
- (a) By its servants and agents to enter upon, expropriate, break up, take or enter into possession of or use those portions of Lots 7, 9, 10 and 11 of Block "G" of the West 3/4 of Lot 127, Group 1, Plan 1254, New Westminster District, shown outlined in red colour on Plan 22210 deposited in the Land Registry Office in the City of New Westminster, Province of British Columbia.
- (b) By its servants and agents to enter upon any real property which may be injuriously affected by the exercise of any of the aforesaid powers for the purpose of executing any works of construction, maintenance, or repair in mitigation of injuries done or apprehended or in reduction of compensation.

3. This By-law shall, before coming into effect, be published once in the B. C. Gazette and in a newspaper published or circulating in the Municipality of Burnaby and a certified copy of the by-law shall be filed in the Land Registry Office in the City of New Westminster, in the Province of British Columbia.
