THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 4295

A BY-LAW to expropriate a right-of-way for drainage or sewerage purposes.

WHEREAS the Council may operate, maintain, improve, extend or alter any existing drainage or sewerage systems and acquire all appliances, equipment, materials, real property, easements and rights-of-way required therefore.

AND WHEREAS the Council may by by-law enter upon, expropriate, break up, take or enter into possession of, and use any real or personal property in any way necessary or convenient for any of the aforesaid purposes without the consent of the owners of the real or personal property, but subject to the restrictions contained in Division (4) of Part XII of the Municipal Act.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:-

1. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY EXPROPRIATION BY-LAW 1961".

2. The Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby is hereby authorized and empowered by its servants and agents to enter upon, expropriate, break up, take or enter into possession of and use, without the consent of the owners of the real property but subject to the restrictions contained in Division (4) of Part XII of the Municipal Act, a right-of-way for drainage or sewerage purposes through, under and over All and Singular that certain parcel or tract of land situate lying and being in the Municipality of Burnaby in the Province of British Columbia and being more particularly known and described as the West Twenty feet of Lot 26 of Lot 94 Group 1 Plan 720 New Westminster District.

3. This by-law shall, before coming into effect, be published once in the B. C. Gazette and in a newspaper published or circulating in the Municipality of Burnaby and a certified copy of the by-law shall be filed in the Land Registry Office in the City of New Westminster, in the Province of British Columbia.
