THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY BY-LAW NO. 5102

A BY-LAW to expropriate certain real property within the Municipality pursuant to the provisions of the Housing Act, being Chapter 183 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1960 and amendments thereto.

WHEREAS the Government of Canada has made provision to assist municipalities, subject to the approval of the Province, in the clearance, replanning, rehabilitation and modernization of blighted or substandard areas.

AND WHEREAS The Corporation of the District of Burnaby has entered into an agreement dated the 23rd day of August, 1966 with Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation pursuant to section 23B of the National Housing Act, 1954 to implement a project for the clearance, replanning, rehabilitation and modernization of that blighted or substandard area of the Municipality shown outlined in red colour on Schedule "A" annexed to the said agreement.

AND WHEREAS the Province of British Columbia has approved the said project.

AND WHEREAS the real property hereinafter described is within the said area of the Municipality.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

- 1. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY EXPROPRIATION BY-LAW NO. 10, 1967".
- 2. The Council, for the clearance, replanning, rehabilitation and modernization of the said area, does hereby acquire, expropriate, and take possession of that parcel of real property within the Municipality more particularly known and described as Lot 1, Block 11, of the North Half of District Lot 116, Group 1, Plan 1236, New Westminster District, save and except the North Seventy (70)

feet thereof, New Westminster District, subject to the provisions of Division (4) of PartX11 of the Municipal Act.

3. This By-law shall, before coming into effect, be published once in the B. C. Gazette and in a newspaper published or circulating in the Municipality of Burnaby and a certified copy of the by-law shall be filed in the Land Registry Office in the City of New Westminster, in the Province of British Columbia.
