BY-LAW NO. 6453

A BY-LAW to Stop Up and Close to Traffic Portions of Road

WHEREAS that portion of road shown outlined in red on plan annexed hereto was established as road by those certain plans deposited in the Land Registry Office at the City of New Westminster, Province of British Columbia, under Number 1925.

AND WHEREAS the said portion of road is no longer required for road purposes.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This By-Law may be cited as "BURNABY ROAD CLOSING BY-LAW NO. 3, 1974".
2. That portion of road being all and singular those certain parcels or tracts of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Municipality of Burnaby, in the Province of British Columbia, and being a portion of Block Forty-one (41), District Lot One hundred and fifty three (153), Group One (1), Plan 1925, New Westminster District, which said portion is more particularly described as that portion of road in Block Forty-one (41) of District Lot One hundred and fifty-three (153), Group One (1), New Westminster District, dedicated as road by Plan 1925 and as shown outlined in red on By-Law Plan prepared by R.A. Baxter, B.C.L.S. and sworn the twelfth day of February, 1974, a copy of which is attached hereto, is hereby stopped up and closed to traffic.
3. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized and empowered to petition the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to abandon the said portions and vest title thereto in the name of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby.

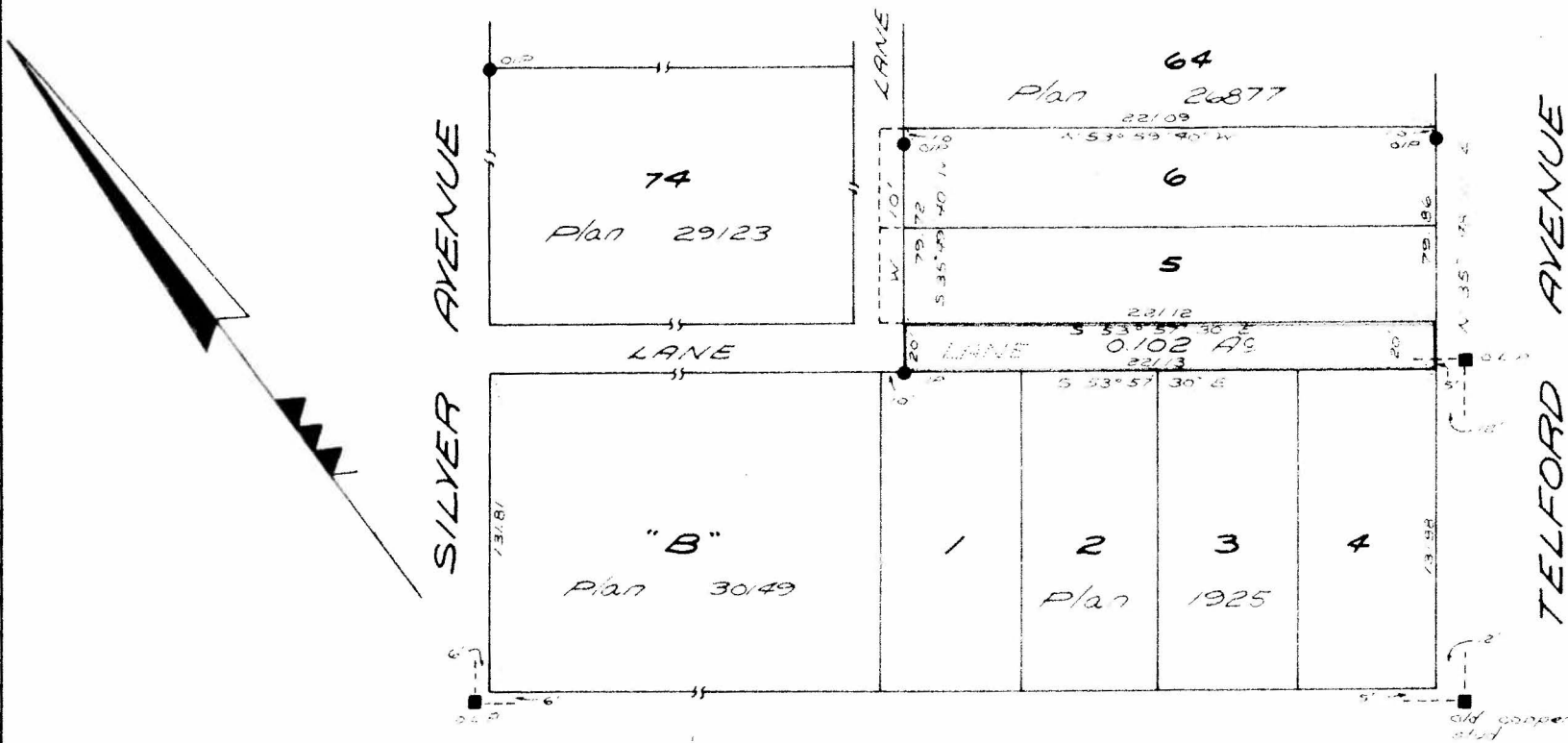
