

THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 6469

A BY-LAW to authorize the expropriation of certain real property.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary and in the public interest to expropriate the real property hereinafter described for highway purposes and to construct and install therein and thereon necessary municipal works and services.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This By-Law may be cited as "BURNABY HIGHWAY EXPROPRIATION BY-LAW NO. 1, 1974".

2. For highway purposes and for the construction and installation therein and thereon of necessary municipal works and services, The Corporation of the District of Burnaby is hereby authorized, empowered, without the consent of the owners of the real property, but subject to the provisions of Division (4) of Part XIII of the "Municipal Act".

(a) By its servants and agents to enter upon, expropriate, break up, take or enter into possession of and use all and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Municipality of Burnaby, in the Province of British Columbia, and being more particularly known and described as that portion of Lot Two (2) of Block One (1), the South Half of District Lot One hundred and sixteen (116), Group One (1), Plan 1439, New Westminster District, as shown outlined in red on the By-Law Plan prepared by Bryan S. Berting, British Columbia Land Surveyor, and sworn to on the 20th day of March, 1974, a copy of which is attached hereto.

(b) By its servants and agents to enter upon any real property which may be injuriously affected by the exercise of any of the aforesaid powers for the purpose of executing any works of construction, maintenance or repair in mitigation of injuries done or apprehended or in reduction of compensation.

3. This By-Law shall, before coming into effect, be published once in the B.C. Gazette and in a newspaper published or circulating in the Municipality of Burnaby and a certified copy of the by-law shall be filed in the Land Registry Office at New Westminster, in the Province of British Columbia.

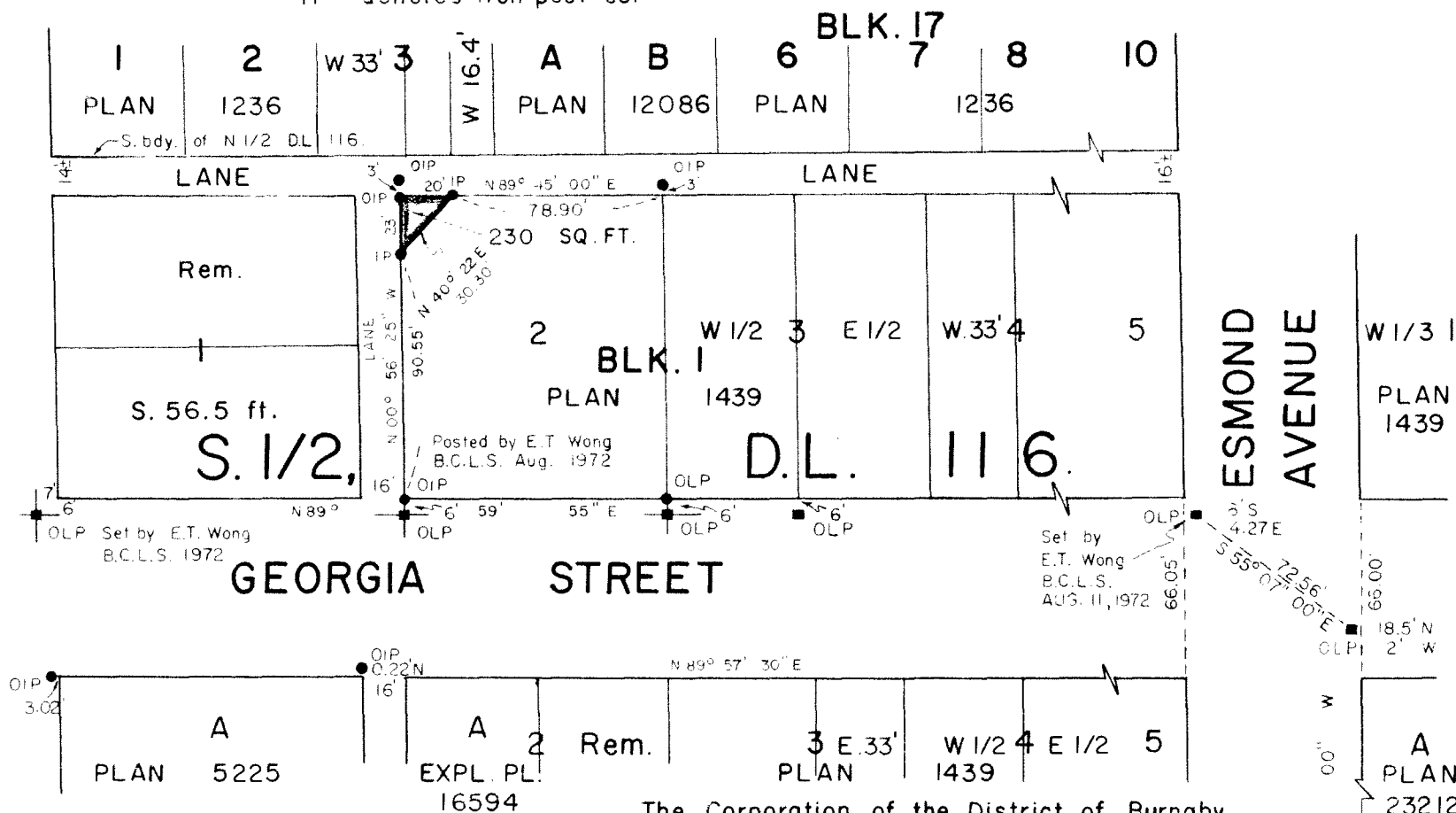
