BY-LAW NO. 6610

A BY-LAW to remove the reservation for park purposes placed upon certain lands.

WHEREAS by By-law No. 3047 adopted by Council on the 22nd day of May, 1950 and filed in the Land Registry Office at New Westminster under Number 33184, those certain lands situate, lying and being in the Municipality of Burnaby, in the Province of British Columbia, more particularly known and described as Lots Fifty-Two(52), Fifty-Three (53) and Fifty-Four (54) of Lot One Hundred Thirty-Two (132), Group One (1), Plan 1493, New Westminster District, were set apart for park purposes.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable and in the public interest to remove the said reservation placed upon the said lands.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

 This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY PARK RESERVATION REMOVAL BY-LAW 1975".

2. The Council does hereby remove the reservation for park purposes placed upon Lots 52, 53 and 54 of Lot 132, Group 1, Plan 1493, New Westminster District, by By-Law No. 3047.
