

THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 6791

A BY-LAW to amend By-Law No. 1914, being the "Burnaby Automatic Vending Machine By-Law 1946".

The Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY AUTOMATIC VENDING MACHINE BY-LAW 1946, AMENDMENT BY-LAW 1975".

2. Section 8.A(1) of By-Law No. 1914 as amended by By-Law No. 6413 is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

"8.A (1) Every owner of an automatic vending machine or every person who makes available, or who helps to make available, for use or operation any automatic vending machine shall obtain a license therefor and shall pay the license fee set out hereunder:

- (a) For each automatic vending machine for the sale of confectionery when such machine is operated by the insertion of coins greater than one cent..... \$ 11.00
- (b) For each automatic vending machine for the sale of stationery..... \$ 11.00
- (c) For each automatic vending machine for the sale of tobacco, cigars or cigarettes \$ 11.00
- (d) For each automatic vending machine for the sale of any other goods of any kind.. \$ 11.00
- (e) For each automatic vending machine for the vending of amusements of any kind when such machine is operated by the insertion of coins greater than one cent \$ 27.50
- (f) For each automatic vending machine for the sale of confectionery where the said machine is operated by the insertion of one cent coins..... \$ 5.50
- (g) For each automatic vending machine for the vending of amusements of any kind operated by the insertion of one cent coins..... \$ 5.50

- (h) For each postage stamp vending machine.. \$ 5.50
- (i) For each coin operated radio receiver... \$ 5.50"

Read a third time this 29th day of December, 1975.
