

THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 6900

A BY-LAW to provide for the biennial election  
of Aldermen.

WHEREAS notwithstanding any other provisions of  
the Municipal Act or of the Letters Patent or Supplementary  
Letters Patent of a municipality, the Council may by by-law  
provide that all Aldermen shall be elected biennially.

AND WHEREAS the said by-law shall make provision  
for the transition from an annual election to a biennial  
election of Aldermen.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the  
District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY MUNICIPAL  
ELECTION BY-LAW 1976".
2. At the municipal election in 1976, those persons  
nominated for the office of Alderman shall be elected for a  
term of one year only and thereafter, commencing at the municipal  
election in 1977, those persons nominated for the office of  
Alderman shall be elected biennially.
