

THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 7173

A BY-LAW to expropriate certain real property for pleasure, recreation, and community uses of the public.

WHEREAS Council may by by-law acquire by purchase, lease, or otherwise, accept, and hold any real or personal property within the municipality for pleasure, recreation, or community uses of the public, including public library, art gallery, museum, arena, and exhibition buildings.

AND WHEREAS Council may expropriate subject to Division (4) of Part XII of the Municipal Act any real property for the aforesaid purposes.

AND WHEREAS Council deems it desirable and in the public interest to expropriate the real property more particularly hereinafter described for pleasure, recreation and community uses of the public and in particular for the Northeast Burnaby Recreation/Library Complex.

AND WHEREAS the said real property is vested in The Director, The Veterans' Land Act.

AND WHEREAS the Council may expropriate the said real property with the consent of the Governor in Council and subject to any terms that may be prescribed by the Governor in Council.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY EXPROPRIATION BY-LAW NO. 2, 1978".
2. The Council does hereby expropriate in fee simple with the consent of the Governor in Council and subject to any terms that may be prescribed by the Governor in Council for pleasure, recreation, and community uses of the public and in particular for the Northeast Burnaby Recreation/Library Complex that parcel of real property situate, lying and being in the

Municipality of Burnaby, in the Province of British Columbia, more particularly known and described as Lot 1, Block 23, District Lot 6, Group 1, Plan 6991, New Westminster District, except the West 80 feet thereof.

3. This By-law shall, before coming into effect, be published once in the B. C. Gazette and in a newspaper published or circulating in the Municipality of Burnaby and a certified copy of the by-law shall be filed in the Land Registry Office at New Westminster, in the Province of British Columbia.
