BYLAW NO. 8682

A BYLAW to regulate the parking of motor vehicles within Bonsor Park

The Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

- 1. This Bylaw may be cited as BURNABY BONSOR PARK PARKING REGULATION BYLAW.
- 2. In this Bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires,
 - nsor Park" means all and singular that certain cel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and ng in the Municipality of Burnaby, in the Province British Columbia, more particularly known described Municipality of Burnaby, Lot 72, Block 24, District s 152 and 153, Group 1, New Westminster District, n 46976;
 - (b) "park user" means a person who is in Bonsor Park for the purpose of participating in a function or using or enjoying a facility therein but does not include a person who leaves a motor vehicle in Bonsor Park while he attends at premises outside the park;
 - (c) "parking lot" means an area in Bonsor Park that is marked, signed or posted as such.
- 3. No person other than a park user shall park a motor vehicle in Bonsor Park.

- 4. No person shall park a motor vehicle in Bonsor Park
 - (a) elsewhere than in a parking lot, or
 - (b) in contravention of a sign prohibiting parking or limiting the time during which a motor vehicle may be legally parked.
- 5. The Director Recreation and Cultural Services may authorize a contractor to remove and impound any motor vehicle that is parked in violation of a provision of this Bylaw, and the owner of such motor vehicle shall pay to the said contractor the costs of removal and impoundment before the motor vehicle is returned to his possession.
- 6. Every person who violates section 3 or 4 of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable, on conviction, to a fine of ten dollars.
