

THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BYLAW NO. 9043

A BYLAW to amend BURNABY FIRE SERVICES BYLAW 1983

The Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This Bylaw may be cited as BURNABY FIRE SERVICES AMENDMENT BYLAW 1988.
2. Paragraph (b) of section 2 of BURNABY FIRE SERVICES BYLAW 1983 is repealed.
3. The said Bylaw is amended by striking out the term "Director-Fire Services" and the word "Director" where they appear throughout the Bylaw and substituting therefor "Fire Chief".
4. Section 3(2) of the said Bylaw is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

"(2) The Deputy Fire Chiefs shall report to the Fire Chief, and the Deputy designated by the Fire Chief to act in his absence has all the powers and shall perform the duties of the Fire Chief in his absence."
5. Paragraph (a) of section 4(1) of the said Bylaw is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

"(a) has successfully completed high school or has equivalent academic qualifications,"

6. Section 7(2) of the said Bylaw is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

"(2) No person other than a member shall ride on any fire apparatus unless authorized to do so by the officer in charge."

7. Section 9(2) of the said Bylaw is amended by:

(a) repealing paragraph (b) therefor; and

(b) renumbering paragraph (c) as paragraph (b)

8. The said Bylaw is further amended by repealing the heading "PART III SMOKING" and inserting, after section 10, the following:

"PART III SERVICE STATION SAFETY

11. (1) No person shall install, maintain or keep installed in a service station any equipment or circuitry that enables any pump designed for the dispensing of gasoline to be pre-authorized or activated prior to handling by the customer, but this provision shall not apply to a pump handled exclusively by employees of the service station.

(2) Every service station operator shall post and keep continuously posted:

(a) conspicuous signs that clearly identify the location of each fire extinguisher;

(b) in the attendant's booth of every self-service station and in the office of any other service

station, a sign providing instructions for dealing with any emergency involving a fire or potential fire, which sign shall include instructions to shut off all electrical power to the pumps, evacuate the area and notify the Fire Department.

12. No person carrying on the business of a gasoline service station shall employ any person as an attendant unless that person has successfully completed a training program in fire safety designed for service station attendants that has been approved by the Fire Chief."

9. Section 16 of the said Bylaw is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

"16. The fees hereinafter set forth shall be paid to the Corporation by applicants for permits and inspections.

- (a) Installation of combustible-liquid tanks, piping systems and dispensers:
 - (i) each combustible liquid tank and piping system \$30.00
 - (ii) each combustible-liquid dispensing hose \$10.00
- (If more than 2 site visits are required, an additional amount of \$30.00 per visit will be charged.)
- (b) For the requested inspection of a building:
 - (i) buildings or structures of 3 storeys or less with an area not exceeding 600 m² and that fall within Part 9 of the B.C. Building Code \$30.00/hour

(ii) all other buildings and
structures

\$50.00 for the
first hour and
\$30.00/hour
thereafter"

10. Section 8 of this Bylaw shall come into force on the
first day of September, 1988.
