CITY OF BURNABY

BYLAW NO. 9777

A BYLAW to further the care, protection, promotion and preservation of the health of the inhabitants of Burnaby by requiring the posting of signs warning of the dangers of fetal alcohol syndrome.

The Council of the City of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This Bylaw may be cited as BURNABY FETAL ALCOHOL SYNDROME WARNING SIGN BYLAW.

- 2. In this Bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires:
 - (a) "licensed establishment" means any establishment licensed or required to be licensed under the provisions of the <u>Liquor Control and Licensing Act</u> and includes restaurants;
 - (b) "proprietor" means a person who, alone or as a member of a group, ultimately controls and directs the operations of a licensed establishment and includes a person in actual physical charge thereof.

3. Every proprietor of a licensed establishment shall post and at all times keep posted in that licensed establishment a sign or signs warning of fetal alcohol syndrome in accordance with the following requirements:

- (a) for any licensed establishment from which alcoholic beverages are sold for off-premises consumption, there shall be at least one sign, located so that it is clearly visible from all locations where the sale or dispensing of alcoholic beverages takes place;
- (b) for any licensed establishment where alcoholic beverages are sold for consumption or permitted to be consumed on the premises, there shall be at least one sign conspicuously displayed in each public washroom located in that establishment;

- (i) be not less than 21.5 cm (8.5 inches) by 13.9 cm(5.5 inches) in dimension;
- (ii) have lettering not less than 1.26 cm (0.5 inches)
 in height;
- (iii) contain the wording and the image shown in Schedule "A".

4. Every person who contravenes any provision of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and, on summary conviction, is liable to a fine of not more than Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars.
