At a Meeting of the Council held as above, all the members were present, the Reeve in the chair.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

The Constable's report was received and read.

The Medical Officer reported for the year 1902, the following infectious cases:-

The typhoid cases are now at Bamet, and arise from the persons drinking water out of the ditch. There are about 250 people residing at Bamet, Whites and Japs.

Rechenbach's slaughter-house, McCulloch's mill ranch, the Chinese garden and the public schools have been visited at regular intervals and found in a satisfactory condition.

Canceled coupons due Dec 1st to the value of \$750.⁰⁰ were received from the Bank of Montreal.

Messrs Livingston Garrett King wrote thanking the Council for the promptness with which the Hoozkins claim had been settled.

The matter of Mr Cork's trespass by a ditch on the Barbours, was laid over.

Messrs Edmunds & Edmunds wrote respecting the diverting of surface water from the North road on to Mr Van's property. Councillor Bly reported on the matter & he and Councillor Smith were appointed a Committee to give it prompt attention, the Clerk to refer to Messrs Edmunds to that effect.

Tenders for laying corduroy on the old North road were opened and received as follows:-

On motion the latter was accepted.

The Clerk (Walter Waeker) was appointed Returning Officer, and the Municipal Hall the place for the coming Municipal Elections.
