Sections 1 to 4 were let to Messrs. Stewart and Hawthorne, the lowest tenderers, and owing to the failure of the Government in redeeming their promise of a grant, the remaining sections were dropped for the present. The work was completed within 60 days, and security \$112 to be provided for satisfactory completion. Report adopted.

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The Clerk was instructed to write Mr Kidd re. the non-appropriation for Small Holdings roads.

The balance of the Abner's acc \$26⁰⁰ was ordered to be paid.

The question of the Tax Sale was laid over.

The Clerk was ordered to inform the Corporation. So. M. Vancouver Council that the Bridge on Burnside road 70' x 16' required replanking with 3" planks, which with some necessary shoring would cost about \$60.
