

Bumaby Hall, 11 July, 1903

2.30 pm.

The Council met time and place as above, all the members being present, the Reeve presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

The Reeve reported the result of enquiries respecting North road. A petition was read and received from W. R. Turkin and sixteen others, asking the Council not to allow the V. W. Yukon railway to cross the road at its present location. A letter from the Department of Lands & Works was read stating that the road had never been gazetted. The Clerk was instructed to inform the petitioners that the Council would do all it could in the matter.

The Clerk reported that the Chief Commissioner of Land Works (Hon. R. B. B. B.) had promised to reimburse the cost of his new Brunette bridge on the North road.

Also that he had received from the Govt. Agent a cheque for \$500[±] being the grant to Bumaby for the North road.

The Reeve reported that he had instructed Mr. J. W. Went to take immediate proceedings to collect Road-tax from the defaulting railway employees; and that the Solicitor hoped to be able to do so without litigation.

Br's Rumble & Stude were empowered to order 50 yds each of cracked road for their wards, advances on account to the extent of 75% of value to be made until the work is required.
