

Barnaby Hall

Friday 18 Sep 1903 2.30 pm.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment, time & place as above, all the members being present, the Revue in the chair.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Cr. Bly reported that the City Council were agreeable to the repair of Tenth Avenue.

Tenders were opened for the bridges on Johnston rd. as follows:-

The contract was let to Mr Allen being the lowest tenderer, the work to be completed within two months and satisfactory bonds to be provided.

There being only one tender for work on Hazard rd. it was laid over, Cr. Bly & Byrne to report at next meeting.

Cr. Bly was given further time to report re Carbon rd. bridge, as was also Cr. Smith re. Barnett rd.

It was resolved that the Council meet in Committee Sept-21st at 2.30 pm. to inspect Mr Thursells contract work on North Star road, Boundary rd, a road near Mr Paterson's, Atkinson & Cook roads, and the cleaning of ditches on Vancouver road, and to report next meeting.

Cr. Stude reported that Jwoep's contract was not completed according to specifications. He was authorized to engage a man for two or three days to brush Vancouver road.

Cr. Spott was authorized to have about 10 chains of grading done on Hastings rd opposite Mr L. Stie's property.

A proposition re broken road from a resident in W. 6 was laid over. Also a letter from Mr Jones re public road repairs.

By permission, Mr Councillor Cameron of Coquitlam addressed the Council re further repairs of North roads.

18th September 1903.

Mr. Bejff Smith were appointed to confer with the Council of Boguslain & authorized to expend not more than \$150[±]. Quarterly's monthly of a total expenditure not to exceed \$300[±] in corduroying about 40 chains with cedar 4 in thick and 9 ft long. To Cameron to call for tenders in 10 chain sections.

On request of Boguslain Council a statement of expenditure re North road was furnished to Council's Cameron.

The use of the Hall on usual terms was granted for a meeting in support of the candidature of Mr J. C. Brown, Provincial District.

Mr. Bejff Smith were requested to report next meeting re extension of Sixth Street requested by Mr. Beane.

To avoid clashing with the Royal Agricultural Society's meeting at New Westminster, the Council then adjourned to Monday Oct 5th at 2.30 pm. to be advertised in 'Columbian' & 'Wald' newspapers.
