

Burnaby Hall, 29th August 1903

2.30 pm.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment time and place as above, all the members being present, the Reeve in the chair.

The minutes of the preceding meeting were read and confirmed.

Dr. Bly reported re Tenth Avenue (City) and was authorized to communicate with the City Council, that being an intermunicipal road.

Tenders were opened for repair of Smith Avenue as follows:— Mr. McMurray 65/-, J. Wray 80/-.
The Contract was let to Mr. McMurray.

The Cambon road bridge tenders were again laid over unopened, the land owners in Lot-10, not having furnished the right of way. Dr. Bly was instructed to report next meeting.

Dr. Stude reported re Purleyson road and was granted further time.

Dr. Spurr submitted specifications re Hazard road, which were approved, and tenders ordered to be advertised for, to be in by September 5th, as did also

Mr Byrne regarding Shel Creek Bridge, with the
same result.

Mr Smith submitted a proposal to build two
bridges on Johnston road, which was laid over.

It was resolved re Barnett road, that \$300[±]
be appropriated on condition that the Province spend a
similar amount: Mr Smith to report next meeting.

Mr Bay was authorized to act re. Reply to
Mullins family, quarantined.

It was also resolved to advertise for tenders in
the Columbian & World (Laird) for repair of Jubilee
rd. from Pacific Ry Station to G. Chamberlain corner,
about 4 chains. Also for Fuleyson road repairs.

Mr Spitt was authorized to spend not more
than \$20[±] in slashing Hastings road.

A reply to a communication received from
St. Vanc. Municipality, the Club was instructed to
ask for copy of specifications, & a sum of not
more than \$50[±] appropriated for faveling part of
Boundary road.

The dangerous crossing question on the North
road at Sapperton was laid over, the Club being
instructed to write to the Railway Co for a plan
of the same.

The question of repairs of Johnston road W. was
laid over.

In answer to a request from the Association, it
was resolved to grant \$75[±] to the Central Park Squarmental
Association & Farmers Institute, same as last year.

The Council then adjourned to September 5th
at 2.30. pm.
