

Bunaby Hall, 16th April 1904.

2.30 p.m.

The Council met time and place as above, all the members being present, the Reeve in the chair.

The minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved.

A letter was received from Cozintlam Council re gravel instead of corduroy for North road. Councillor Love was appointed to act with the Engineer of Cozintlam, to search for gravel.

The Clerk was instructed to write to the U.N.Y. Rybo respecting the raising of its track 2 ft. above the original level of the crossing over North road.

Mr. Langis addressed the Council re the diversion of Kalkem road to the boundary line between his property & that of Geo Kerr. He promised to exchange land necessary, and to construct the road equal to the present road, and to dig a ditch. Councillor Byrne gave notice of introduction of a Bylaw to amend the Bunaby Road Bylaw 1898.

The Clerk announced that the Assessor had returned the Assessment Roll for 1904.

The Reeve and Councillors Byrne, Stude, Evans, and Pumble were elected members of the Court of Revision, and the first sitting of the Court was fixed for Saturday 28th May at 10.30 a.m. at Bunaby Hall.

A petition for the opening out of the road between Lots 4 and 6, North road and Lot 10, was referred to Councillors Love, Hill & Byrne to report.

A letter was received from the Mayor of New Westminster endorsing a form of suggested resolution re Dominion Exhibition 1905.

It was moved by Councillor Pumble, seconded by Councillor Love and resolved:-

Whereas the annual exhibition known as the "Dominion Exhibition" conducted under the patronage of, and receiving financial assistance from the Government of Canada, has never been held in British Columbia.

And whereas it is desirable in the interest of the trade and commerce of Canada, that the Eastern and Western Provinces should be more closely drawn together in matters of trade.

And whereas for proper knowledge of the manufactures of the Eastern provinces, a vast amount of business goes from this Province to other countries, a large part of which might be retained in Canada.

And whereas the holding of the said Exhibition in British Columbia, would tend to draw attention to the immense natural resources of the country, and advance the development of the same to the advantage of the whole Dominion.

Therefore be it resolved that this Council respectfully request the Honourable the Minister of Agriculture to name British Columbia as the Province in which the Dominion Exhibition of 1905 shall be held.

And be it further resolved that in the opinion of this Council, the City of New Westminster would be the most suitable place, as things considered, for the holding of said Exhibition.

The Clerk was instructed to send copies of the foregoing resolution to the Hon the Minister of Agriculture, Hon Senator Duggan, Hon Morrison M.P. and New Westminster City Council.

The foregoing letter from Coquitlam Council was handed in by the Reeve and ordered to be filed.
