

Bunbury Hall, 30 April 1904

2.30 p.m.

The Council met time and place as above all the members being present, the Rector in the chair.

The minutes of the preceding meeting were read & confirmed.

The Rector of Coquillam was present, and certain matters re. North road were discussed. Councillors Evans & Love were deputed to act re. Gravel, wh. it was understood Mr. Heizer would give gratis for the road.

A letter from the U.W.Ry. Ry Co was read stating that the road at the crossing had only been raised by ballasting about 8 inches, to the Engineer's stakes which were on the ground when the Council met - Mr. Hending there, and which was then understood by the Councillors. The gravel used in

grading up was the same as used elsewhere along the line. The letter was handed to Rector Borth, for

the information of Coquillam Council.

The Constable reported 'nil' for April.

30th April 1904

The Collector reported :-

It was resolved: That \$30⁰⁰/_x be voted to the Royal Agricultural & Industrial Society, New Westminster towards its Prize List for 1904 Exhibition.

Farmers Advocate

A letter was read from the William Weld Co (Luis) proprietor of the "Farmers Advocate" which has a circulation of 50,000 copies. The Company offered to write on Burnaby Municipality to occupy 3 pages of the Advocate with cuts & letterpress, & to donate the linotype & the cuts to the Council. Letters were read from Chelmsford testifying to the satisfactory results from a similar write-up of that Municipality. Mr Lindsay, representing the Company, attended and addressed the Council, producing a mass of correspondence with proposed immigrants.

It was proposed & seconded by Councillors Byrne and Hoel respectively & carried, Councillor Rumble alone dissenting: That the offer be accepted.

The petition to open Inman Ave. was laid over.

Cr. Love was empowered to get tenders for gravel for Sixth Street

Tenders were ordered for the construction of the road to Lot 161.

The fencing of the Municipal Hall grounds was laid over for report.
