

## Special Meeting

A Special meeting, at the call of the Reeve, was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, December 6<sup>th</sup> 1905, at 7.30 p.m. for the purpose of considering the expediency or otherwise of applying for a record of water for municipal purposes from Seymour Creek, North Vancouver.

There were present The Reeve in the Chair, Councillors Byrne, Stride, Love, Hill, and Rumble.

Water application. The Reeve explained that at a well attended meeting of Tax-payers and Residents held at Central Park Schools on the previous night a resolution was unanimously passed that the Council should take immediate steps for securing a record of Water from Seymour Creek for Municipal purposes. The proposed Water Company had given notice of its intention to ask for a record and as it was considered undesirable that they should hold a record of a valuable franchise which the Corporation had it within their power to apply for, and an application for 2000 inches was to be heard on Tuesday, the 12<sup>th</sup> instant on behalf of the Vancouver City Council, it was necessary, if the Council desired to secure the franchise that immediate steps should be taken to give and publish the requisite notices.

The following motion was proposed by Couns. Byrne, seconded by Councillor Rumble and unanimously carried:-

Resolved: That the Burnaby Municipal Council do make application for a record of 1000 Miners inches of water from Seymour Creek, said Creek being situated in the Municipality of North Vancouver.

It was further

Resolved: That the Reeve and the Clerk be, and they are hereby, authorized to take such steps as are necessary to carry into full effect the foregoing resolution.
