At a meeting of the Council held, in pursuance of adjournment, on Saturday, Nov. 16. 1907

Present: Reeve Byrne (in the Chair) Councillors Sprott, Stride, Love, Cluff, Anderson & Rumble.

88 Minutes. The Minutes of Meetings held on Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> were read and confirmed.

89 Road. Lot. 118. Minute 59. A deputation consisting of Mess<sup>rs</sup> Mc Innes, Meadows and Nicholson waited upon the Council with reference to the application already before the Council.

In order to meet the objection raised by the Council to build a road lengthwise of the Creek Mess<sup>rs</sup> Meadows & Nicholson offered to sell to the Council, for road purposes, a strip of land at the rate of \$1500 per acre. viz. \$50 for 32 ft x 80 ft)

Resolved: That the consideration of the offer be referred to the Board of Works for report by the next meeting of the Council.

90 M<sup>rs</sup> Roops application. Minute 61 was continued.

91 Plan of sub division Lot 188. Minute 58. This plan amended to meet the Council's requirements was resubmitted, and it was

Resolved: The plan as now submitted be approved and the Reeve be authorized to sign the same

92 Fill North Arm Road. Minute 63. Councillor Sprott submitted specification, and reported having called for tenders by advertisement.

Resolved: That the specification now submitted be approved

97 Recommendations to Union of Municipalities.

Referring to Minutes 15.33 and 75., it was

Resolved: That the following matters be recommended to the Committee of the Union having charge of the proposed amendments to the Municipal Clauses and other Municipal Acts, namely (1) Legislation absolutely prohibiting Sunday Shooting within Municipal and ex Municipal areas. (2) A more precise definition of the improvements necessary upon

small parcels of land, such as lots, to entitle an owner to be exempt from Wild Land Tax.

- 98 B. C. Railway's promise of gravel. Minute 76. Mr D. J. Stewart, Acting Local Manager, wrote expressing regret for delay in putting down gravel and stating the same should be done without further delay.
- 99 Brunette River Bridge. Minute 77. The Reeve reported that the protection works had been satisfactorily completed for the sum of \$65 contributed by Mr Hudson. The report was approved and the clerk was instructed to write the Coquitlam Council accordingly.
- 100 Boulevard Hastings Road. Minute 82. Couns. Love on behalf of Mr Curtis, asked the Council to contribute towards the expense of clearing the boulevard Mr Curtis having done one half.

- 108 Approach to Buller Road Station. Letters from H. Hatt-look, Geo. A. Gray and L. J. Thomas asking for improvement of approach to Station, were read. The matter was referred to the Councillor of the Ward to report to next meeting.
- 109 W. Phillips' application. A letter was read from W. Phillips asking for a road to enable him to draw out cordwood.  
The application was laid over.
- 110 Water from creek Dis. Lot 40. A further letter from W. C. J. Piper complaining of contamination of water by faps was read. A report from Dr. Walker to whom the letter had been referred was also read. He stated he had visited the locality and given certain directions, but was of opinion that it was impossible to keep such streams free from pollution. The report was filed for reference.
- 111 Complaint as to Shooting. W. Piper further wrote as to his narrow escapes from death by unskilled sportsman. The Constable was instructed to keep a look out for offenders.
- 112 Negotiations with Vancouver City re Road Seymour Creek. The Reeve submitted a letter received from Mayor Kealy, of North Vancouver, as to the representations made by him, on behalf of the Councils of South Vancouver, Richmond, & Burnaby, to the Vancouver City Council with a view to the City according to those districts similar rights

to the use of Seymour Creek Road for pipe line purposes as had been agreed upon between the City and North Vancouver.

Resolved: That the letter be referred to a Committee consisting of the Reeve and Counc. Spott with full power to act.

113 Ditches & Water Courses Act. Mr. Alex. Dow wrote asking for forms under the above act and the clerk was requested to forward the same.

114 Sub division of Dis Lot 186. Letters were read from Mess<sup>rs</sup> Mackenzie & Robertson and Mess<sup>rs</sup> Hermon & Burwell as to the right of the Council to require continuation of roads to water front. The matter was referred to the Committee with power to obtain legal advice if necessary.

115 Application from Mr. Wilson for <sup>improvement to</sup> road. Counc. Love applied on behalf of Mr. Wilson for repairs to Tenth Avenue East to enable him to draw cordwood from his premises.

The road being intermunicipal the applicant was referred to New Westminster Council.

116 Dogs at large. In consequence of receipt of numerous complaints it was

Resolved: That the clerk be instructed to write Mr. Donald Ross requesting him to keep his dogs from running at large to the annoyance of passers by.

117 Adjournment: Resolved That the Council stand adjourned till Saturdays Nov. 30. 1907 at 2.30 being pay day
