

March 18' 1907.

At an adjourned meeting of the Council held in pursuance of minute 1847 at the Municipal Hall on Monday, March 18th, 1907, at 8 o'clock p.m.

Present: Reeve Byrne (in the Chair) Councillors Skinner, Stride, Love, Anderson & Rumble.

Mr McQuarrie, Solicitor was in attendance.

The members of the School Board W Donald Ross (Chairman) Trustees Clayton, George, and Maxwell Smith were also present.

Holland Ditch. Mr McQuarrie advised that the only alternative to proceeding with the work required to be done by W Martin would be the preparation of an Agreement by which the whole of the Owners affected would join in the cost of widening and clearing the Jerry Rogers ditch, and agreeing to jointly maintain and keep open and clear the said ditch. It was however a question whether W Martin (who had charge of this case) would advise this course, but in any case such an Agreement, if entered into, should be drawn by the Solicitors, and registered at the Land Office as a charge against the various properties. The parties who should enter into the Agreement were the Owners of Dis Lot 173, 155^A West half, and 155^A East half.

Resolved: That the Clerk write mess^{es} to Mr Leod & Bacchus, and Mr Loewen, Agent for Dr Cook, asking whether they would be prepared to enter into such an Agreement, if W Woollard would be willing, upon the understanding that the maintenance of the Jerry Rogers ditch should be a charge against their respective properties.

Upon being put Councillors Stride, Love, Anderson and Rumble voted "Yea" and Councillor Skinner "Nay" and it was therefore resolved accordingly,

Resolved (Couns. Skinner dissenting) That in the event of the above named parties not

agreeing to enter into an agreement as aforesaid, the work of damming up all inlets to the Holland Ditch be proceeded with, by the Road Foreman and such help as may be necessary, under the direction of the Board of Works, on Monday morning next; and further that the Committee of the Whole meet on Saturday next to consider such replies as may be to hand.

1850 School Board Estimates. The Clerk reported receipt of a letter from the Education Department ruling that all matters of expenditure other than those for purchase of land and erection of buildings were considered as School maintenance.
