

March 2nd 1907.

At a meeting of the Council held, at the Municipal Hall, on Saturday March 2nd 1907, at 2.30 p.m. in pursuance of adjournment

Present: Reeve Byrne in the chair.
Councillors Skinner, Stride, Love, Anderson
and Rumble

1775 Minutes. The minutes of meeting held on February 16. 1907 were read and confirmed.

1776 Appointment of Road Foreman, Constable and Road Tax Collector. In response to the advertisement applications were received from Messrs William Ralph, J. Burkett, John Green, H. Hatt Cook, W. E. Lyne, A. F. Stewart, S. G. Parker, Chas E Wild, and W. H. Madill.

The applications having been read it was
Resolved: That the applications now read be referred to a Committee of the Whole, Councillor Stride in the chair.

The Council then went into Committee and upon resuming Councillor Stride reported that Mr. William Ralph of Central Park had been unanimously recommended for the position.

1777 Resolved: That Mr. William Ralph, of Central Park be, and he is hereby, appointed as

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Road Foreman, Constable, and Road Tax Collector at a salary of Seventy dollars (\$70⁰⁰) per month payable monthly, with a Commission of Ten per cent (10%) upon the amount of Road Tax Collected, and that his duties commence forthwith, the appointment to be subject to the following conditions, namely:

1. That he provide a horse and rig for his use.
2. That he furnish approved security to the extent of \$200.
3. That he devote 50 hours per week to the service of the Council.
4. That he pay over at the end of each month all sums collected by him.

1778

M^r. Peter Gray's engagement. M^r. Peter Gray tendered his resignation as Constable in order that the Council should have the opportunity of selecting a second Constable from some other part of the Municipality as both he and M^r. Ralph resided at Central Park.

The resignation was ordered to be laid upon the table.

1779

Road Appropriation Amending By-Law.

The Council went into committee for the purpose of reconsidering this By-Law. Upon resuming the By-Law was reported as approved, and was read a third time.

Resolved: That the Burnaby Road Appropriation By-Law Amending By-Law 1907 now read a third time be finally passed and the Reeve and the Clerk be, and they are hereby, authorized to sign and seal the same.

1780

Widening of Third Avenue. Minute 1740.

Councillor Love reported that as M^r. Bailey had not estimated for relaying the corduroy,

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fresh tenders had been called for the work. They were as follows

P.B. Resolved: That the tender of Alfred Bailey be accepted, save ^{water} chains of the work only to be put in hand.

1781 Woollard v Burnaby. Holland Road Ditch.

Councillor Skinner reported with reference to minute 1741, that he had employed labour and put in hand the work of damming up all inlets of surplus water draining into the Holland Ditch. He found however that it was practically impossible to prevent the surface water from local streams and ditches finding their way into the said ditch. Thomas Brownlee, the man employed, was of opinion, also, that the flow could not be prevented.

Resolved: That Mr. Ralph, the Road Foreman, be required and instructed to give his first attention to carrying out, if possible, the advice of Counsel and that the Clerk hand to him the plan shewing the inlets to be dammed up.

1782 Woollard v Burnaby. Judgment and costs.

A letter from the Solicitors stating that the costs in this action had been taxed at £ 118⁴.⁰ and requesting payment of this sum together with the amount of judgment £ 510, total £ 628⁴.

Resolved: That the amount be passed and included in this day's payments.

1783 Brushing edge of Central Park. Minute 1744.

The Government's reply stating the work had been authorized, was read.

The minute was ordered to be discharged, and the letter filed.

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- 1784 Agreement for Drainage across Mr. Fitzlanders property.
Minute 1747. Couns. Rumble and Skinner having
reported hereon, it was

Resolved: (Couns. Skinner dissenting)

That the Council enter into an Agreement
with Mr. Fitzlander in pursuance of the
terms of Minute 1747 providing that the
outlet of Mr. Fitzlanders ditch be the S.W.
corner post of his property.

- 1785 Plan of Block 15, Dis. Lot 153. Minute 1751.
W Bailey attended before the Council with
amended plan shewing the ends of proposed
roadway blocked up, and the road allowance
marked as lots.

Resolved: That the question of compliance
of the amended plan with the requirements of the
Statute be referred to the Solicitors for opinion.

1786. School Board Estimates. Minute 1753. The Reeve
reported interview between the Committee and
the School Board. No decision was arrived at,
the Board holding that sums for improvement
of properties, and new expenses, had properly
been included in costs of maintenance of schools.
It was arranged to submit the question to the
Council of Public Instruction for a ruling.

The Board had also not given details of
proposed extraordinary expenditure on sites
and buildings. The Committee had given
the Board to understand that the Council
would provide a sum not exceeding \$1500
upon any approved purchase of land pending
preparation of the detailed estimate.

Resolved: That the report be received and
adopted.

1787. Road to Dis. Lot 118. Minute 1754. W McInnes
again attended urging the Council to open up a

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33 feet road provided by the owners of Dis. Lot 69.

The minute was continued to enable the Committee of the whole to inspect and report.

1788 Slashing Genn Road continuation. Minute 1759. A tender was submitted from Thos. Haddon offering to slash the 60 chains at 9⁰⁰ per chain.

Resolved : That the tender of Thos. Haddon be accepted.

1789 Byrne Road. Minute 1760. The following tenders were received :

Thos. Brownlee 6⁰⁰ per chain

Carl Helman 5⁰⁰ per chain

Resolved : That the tender of Carl Helman be, and the same is hereby, accepted.

1790 Lines of Buller Road. Referring to minute 1714 the Clerk was authorized to ask Mr. Abbott of Hill to survey lines of this road.

1791 Torshore Rights on Burrard Inlet. Minute 1762. The Committee reported having considered this matter. They were of opinion that, as the Council had favourably replied to the queries addressed to them by the Department of Marine & Fisheries they had done all in their power on behalf of the applicants and that to attempt to pass further recommendations with a view to influencing the Department in the exercise of its discretionary powers would not only form a precedent for many other cases, but might expose the Council to a possible remonstrance from the Department.

Resolved : That the report be approved and adopted.

1792 Brunette River Bridge. Minute 1763 was ordered to be continued.

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- 1793 Seymour Creek Properties - Custody of Deeds. Minute 1765 was ordered to be continued.
- 1794 Fulton Street. Minute 1768. Councillor Stude reported that he had had sufficient work done to give access to Mr. Forrest Porter's house. W. Clarence Porter was reported to be unwilling to give road allowance through the two end lots.

- 1796 Boulevard Boundary Road. Mr. Rose of Central Park presented a petition asking for the clearing of the boulevard on one side of Boundary Road
- Resolved: That the matter be referred to the Board of Works with power to act.
- 1797 Permission to cut down Tree. Mr. Harding asked permission to cut down and remove tree in front of his house Royal Oak Road. Granted.
- 1798 Plans of sub-divisions. Mr. Albt. J. Hill sought approval of plan of sub-divisions on Dis Lot 155^A
- Resolved: That the same be approved as drawn.
- The Clerk presented plan of sub-division

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of portion of Dis. Lot 25 (Newcombe Estate) on behalf of Mr. J. R. Pearson. As the lines of adjoining properties were not shewn, and the streets did not appear to be continuous the plan was referred back.

1799 Application from Mr. Trapp. Mr. J. J. Trapp applied for a road to the south part of District Lot 155.

The application was referred to Couns. Skinner for report.

1800 Roadway to Deer Lake from N. E. Councillor Love gave notice of his intention to introduce a By-Law to resume a road allowance 66 feet wide on the North West section line of Dis. Lot 85.

The Reeve and the Clerk were requested to take Solicitors opinion hereon.

1801 Tenth Avenue. The Clerk was requested to write the New Westminster City Council as to proceeding with this work.

1802 Tramway Crossing Wye Road. The Clerk was instructed to ask for a crossing to be laid by the B.C.E.Ry. Co.

1803 Spreading Rock Ward 6. Couns. Rumble was authorized to have rock spread.

1804 Temporary Chairman of Finance. Resolved : That in the absence of Couns. Cliff Councillor Skinner be appointed Chairman of Finance pro tem.
