An adjourned meeting of the Council held in the Municipal Hall on Saturday March 5th 1910.

416 The Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

417 Letter read from T. J. Wright and others asking for McPherson Road to be continued through to Boundary Road. Referred to the Engineer to report to Board of Works.

418 Letter read from Wright Investment Co. with reference to resolution requiring 66 foot lots and asking if on reconsideration Council would allow 33 foot lots.

Resolved that resolution be adhered to & that letter be published in extenso.

419 Letter read from T. M. Beamish asking for permission to build a 3 plank sidewalk on the East side of boundary road from Hastings Street to south boundary of Lot 116 which would be donated to Municipality when finished.

Resolved that offer be accepted subject to sidewalk being built in accordance with instructions from the Engineer.

420 Letter read from W. M. C. Skinner with reference to condition of Lower House Road owing to the heavy

leaving now being done. Resolved that same were received and a written reply by the Council intending fixing up road as soon as possible.

420. Letters read from City Clerk, New Westminster, G.M.C. Coquitlam, and Resident Engineer Great Northern Railway stating that they were agreed to go to meeting as arranged re North Road crossing.

Referred to special committee appointed to meet on the ground.

421. Letter read from Coquitlam Council with reference to this Council's decision to spend \$50 in graveling the Austin Road which was not satisfactory.

423. Letter read from T. Shepherd Sec Burnaby School Board inclosing copy of Order-in-Council authorizing sale of Lots 1, 2, 3 and 4, Block 1, D.L. 28 and to apply proceeds of such sale to the acquisition of suitable grounds for school purposes. Received and filed.

Resolved that the Reeve be and is hereby authorized to sign deeds of property and the Clerk to affix the corporate seal.

424. Letter read from District of North Vancouver enclosing copy resolution with reference to the amendment to the Municipal Elections Act whereby registered owners of property, only should be able to exercise the

franchise and that legislation be introduced making it legal for owners under a registered or unregistered deed or under agreement of sale to have the right to vote. Received and filed and Clerk instructed to reply that the Government amendment was following outlines suggested by Municipal Union.

- 425 Letter from Central Park Progressive association was read enclosing copy of resolution as follows

That a strong protest be made to the B.C. Telephone Co. against the installation of an exchange at Central Park at an increased cost and that a maximum charge of \$5⁰⁰ be established for all telephones with no extra charge for a through service with Vancouver and Westminister Kits-Rumallie.

That the resolution passed by the Central Park Progressive Association be endorsed by the Council.
