

Monday September 18th. 1911.

A Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday 18th September, 1911.

Present. His Worship Reeve Wrent.

Councillors - Goldcott, Rumble, Stride, Mc Gregor, McDonald and McKee.

Moved by Mr Goldcott, seconded by Mr Rumble, that the minutes as typewritten be adopted.

Carried unanimously

The Solicitors report of the sitting of the Railway Commission on The Carbon Road and North Road Crossings was read.

Moved by Mr Goldcott, seconded by Mr Rumble, that the report be received and filed.

Carried unanimously

Mr. T. J. Drain, of 1155, Nelson St, Vancouver, wrote complaining of a nuisance caused by Lo Lee Wang's ranch in D. L. 163, and the Chief of Police submitted his report thereon.

Moved by Councillor Rumble, seconded by Mr Stride, that this matter be left in the hands of the Health Committee and Chief of Police with power to act.

Carried unanimously

W. H. Hearn, Secretary Provincial Exhibition wrote thanking the Council for their grant of \$250. The letter was ordered to be filed.

The Solicitors wrote that they did not consider Mr Edwin Ramsay had any claim against the Municipality in regard to the alleged trespass on the west side of Lots 1, 2 and 3, B.L. 21, D.L. 27, and that they had advised his solicitors to this effect, and were prepared to accept service of any papers thereon, on behalf of the Municipality.

22 hundred and fifty one (151) Group One (1) New Westminster
23 District, the same being assessed, together with the buildings
24 and improvements thereon at the total sum of Three thousand,
25 six hundred dollars (\$3,600) according to the last revised and
26 corrected Assessment Roll of the Municipality.

17 eight hundred and fifteen dollars (\$10815) according to the last
