2 A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal

3 Hall on Monday May 10th. 1915, at 9.15 p.m.

4 Present: His worship Reeve Fraser.

5 Councillors Fan Vel, Coldicutt, Mac Donald, Bevan, Ward, and
6 Murray.

7 Moved by Cr. Fan Vel, Seconded by Cr. Bevan: - "That the Minutes
8 of the meeting of April 26th. 1915, be adopted as typewritten
9 and confirmed."

10 Carried unanimously.

11 Correspondence was received, and dealt with as follows:-

12 Secretary - Royal Institute of Public Health - Invitation to
13 membership.

14 Moved by Cr. Fan Vel, Seconded by Cr. Murray: - "That the
15 letter be referred to the Health Committee."

16 Carried unanimously.

17 Burrs and Wulken re. Road Allowance D.L. 212. asking if
18 this Corporation would consider voiding the gazetting of the
19 35' road allowance on the East Side.

20 Moved by Cr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Cr. Fan Vel: - "That the
21 Corporation Solicitor be instructed to advise that Taxes
22 have not been collected on this road allowance since
23 it was gazetted, and that this Corporation have no
24 intention of cancelling the road allowance."

in writing, their approval of the tentative arrangement
re. Boundary Road.
5. That the Corporation Solicitors be instructed to prepare an
agreement between the City of Vancouver and Burnaby
for future construction and maintenance work on
Boundary Road.
6. That the Clerk ask what action has been taken by the
Government re. request for Grant on account of Trunk
Roads.
