3 A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the

given to raise a special rate not exceeding one mill

Finance Committee Report:- Your Committee met on March 6th. 1916, and recommend:-

5. That the Report of the Engineers re. Wash-outs on Pandora St. and Albert St. be adopted.
6. That the Report of the Engineers re. surface water on Blk. 14, D. S. 99. (G. W. Seddingham) be adopted.
7. That the Claim of T. Waters be referred to the Corporation Solicitors.

8 the Corporation Solicitors, of the offer of Messrs. Wood
9 Gundy & Co. for the issue of \$1,000,000 Serial Debentures
10 was read.

11 Moved by Mr. Mac. Donald, Seconded by Mr. Murray:- "That
12 the action of the Corporation Solicitors be confirmed."

13 Carried unanimously.

14 The Reeve called attention to the death in action, of Private
15 Herbert Scott Penney, and

16 Moved from the Chair, Seconded by Mr. Murray:- "That
17 the heartfelt sympathy and condolence of this Council
18 be conveyed to the parents of the deceased soldier, and
19 also appreciation of his bravery and self-sacrifice in
20 the sacred cause of Country and Empire."

21 Carried unanimously.

23 Mr. Green gave Notice of Motion to introduce, at the next
24 Meeting of the Council, a By Law to cancel the Gauging of
25 the Road Allowance between D.L. 214 and D.L. 215.

26 Mr. Holdom gave Notice of Motion to reduce the Salaries of
27 the Municipal Hall Staff.

28 The Reeve ruled the matter out of order.

29 Mr. Holdom appealed against the decision of the Chair.
30 The Question "Shall the action of the Chair be sustained?"
31 was then put, and

32 Cormier, Mac. Donald, Murray, Coldicutt, Bevan and
33 Green voted in favour.

34 Mr. Holdom voted against.

35 Moved by Mr. Bevan, Seconded by Mr. Mac. Donald:- "That this
36 Council do now adjourn."
