

Monday - November 20th. 1916.

A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday - November 20th. 1916, at 4.30 O'clock. p.m.
Present: - His Worship Reeve Fraser.

Councillors Mac Donald, Murray, Coldicutt, Green, and Holdom,
 Moved by Mr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Mr. Murray: - "That at the
 Minutes of the Meeting of November 6th. 1916, be adopted as
 written and confirmed."

Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:-
 Secretary, School Board - re. Transportation of school children,
 Lowell's district. - making application for the use of
 Municipal Auto for this purpose, along the lines suggested
 by the Reeve, when present at a meeting of the Board on
 November 14th.

Moved by Mr. Murray, Seconded by Mr. Coldicutt: - "That arrangements
 be made to give the service asked for by the School
 Board."

Carried unanimously.

Mr. F. Walker wrote, expressing his thanks for the letter of
 sympathy on account of the death, in action, of his son.
 Moved by Mr. Coldicutt, Seconded by Mr. Mac Donald: - "That
 the letter be received and filed."

Carried unanimously.

The Engineer wrote, forwarding a letter from the B. C.
 Transport Co., in which it was explained that by reason
 of a break in their brusher, and the delay on account of
 sending to England for the necessary part, the company
 would be unable to carry out its tender to supply
 Rock for Hastings - Barnet Road.

The Engineer advised that on account of the recent hard
 frosts, it would be advisable to defer rocking the East
 end of the road, until the early spring.

Moved by Mr. Green, Seconded by Mr. Coldicutt: - "That the
 Balance of the \$6000 appropriated for rocking the East end
 of Hastings - Barnet Road, be held in reserve for the
 purpose, and that it be a recommendation to the 1914
 Council to hold the funds so reserved, for the work now in hand."

Carried unanimously.

The Solicitor wrote re. C. W. R. Yaxco, enclosing copy of a
 letter from Dennis, Marshall, MacNeill and Pugh, advising
 that they expected to receive definite instructions as to
 payment of the amount owing, from the head office at Toronto.

40 Your Committee met on November 15th. 1916, and
41 recommend:-

- 42 1. That the Estimate of Work for the two weeks commencing
43 November 18th. amounting to \$1600, be adopted.
- 44 2. That the Expenditure incurred during the two weeks ended

- 1 November 6th., amounting to \$65.80, be approved.
- 2 3. That 180 feet of Buckingham Road be planked at an
3 estimated cost of \$90.
- 4 4. That a new culvert be constructed under Riversway at Gilley
5 Ave., and a new ditch be constructed through the
6 property south of Riversway, subject to arrangement with
7 the owner.
- 8 5. That the Sidewalk on 4th. Street be extended at an
9 estimated cost of \$40.
- 10 6. That the claim of Mr. S. Hutch be left with the Reeve
11 and the Corporation Solicitors.
- 12 7. That the necessary permission to store, use, and
13 distribute petroleum and all the products thereof,
14 and to refine the same, be granted to the Shell Co. of

- 16 Moved by Mr. Mac Donald, Seconded by Mr. Green: - "That the
17 Report of the Board of Works be amended, by substituting
18 the words & figures "November 20th" for "November 13th."
19 in the second line thereof, and that the Report as so
20 amended, be adopted."

- 22 Moved by Mr. Goldieatt, Seconded by Mr. Mac Donald: - "That
23 the Release of E. L. Williams Mortgage, be signed by the
24 Reeve and the Clerk, and that the Corporate Seal be
25 affixed thereto."

26 Carried unanimously.

- 27 Moved by Mr. Green, Seconded by Mr. Mac Donald: - "That the
28 members of the Court of Revision of the Voters' Lists be nominated
29 by the Chair."

30 Carried unanimously.

- 31 The Reeve named Councillors Green and Holdom to constitute
32 with himself, the Court of Revision of the Voters' Lists, 1914.

33 In accordance with Notice of Motion, it was

- 34 Moved by Mr. Green, Seconded by Mr. Goldieatt: - "That the
35 Burnaby, District Lot 185, Redemption By-Law, 1916, be introduced
36 and read a first time."

- 39 Moved by Mr. Mac Donald, Seconded by Mr. Holdom: - "That the
40 Burnaby, District Lot 185, Redemption By Law, 1916, do pass the
41 First Reading."

42 Carried unanimously.

- 43 Moved by Mr. Goldieatt, Seconded by Mr. Holdom: - "That the
44 Burnaby, District Lot 185, Redemption By Law, 1916, be read

1 a Second time."

2 Carried unanimously.

3 Moved by Mr. Green, Seconded by Mr. Mac Donald:—"That the
4 Burnaby District Lot 135, Resumption By Law, 1916, do pass
5 the Second Reading."

6 Carried unanimously.

7 The Reeve referred to the death of Mr Wm. Mc. Dermott,
8 who was a member of the first Municipal Council,
9 and also one of the earliest School Trustees.

10 Moved by Mr. Coldirett, Seconded by Mr. Mac Donald:—"That
11 the sincere sympathy and condolence of this Council be
12 tendered to Mr. Mc Dermott and family, and that this
13 Council as a body do attend the funeral."

14 Carried unanimously.

16 Moved by Mr. Coldirett, Seconded by Mr. Green:—"That this
17 Council do now adjourn."
