A Regular Meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, August 30th. 1926, at 4.30 p.m.

Present:- His worship Reeve McLean

Councillors Smith, Gray, Hall, Moore, Planché, and Engleby.

Moved by Mr. Smith, Seconded by Mr. Planché:- "That the Minutes of the Meetings of August 16th. and 19th. inst. be adopted as written, and confirmed."

Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was received, and dealt with as follows:-

Secretary, Central Park Farmers' Institute - Invitation to attend the official opening of the 2nd Annual Exhibition on September 15th. p.m.

Moved by Mr. Gray, Seconded by Mr. Engleby:- "That the invitation be accepted."

Carried unanimously.

Secretary - Mr. G. Burnaby Farmers' Institute - Invitation to attend the 2nd. Annual Exhibition on September 14th. p.m.

Moved by Mr. Hall, Seconded by Mr. Gray:- "That the invitation be accepted."

Carried unanimously.

Secretary - Ratepayers' Central Executive - asking the Council to re-consider the fees for sewer connections.

Moved by Mr. Smith, Seconded by Mr. Engleby:- "That the Reeve and the Clerk draft a reply explaining the purpose of the amending By Law."

Carried unanimously.

Secretary - Ratepayers' Central Executive - suggesting that a thoroughly competent engineer be engaged to make a comprehensive survey of the water system for the purpose of formulating a scheme of improvements which could be carried out in sections.

Councillors Gray and Longfellow voted in favour of the amendment which was declared.

Moved by Mr. Moore, Seconded by Mr. Gray: - "That the Engineer be instructed to see that no special or extra concessions be given to any garage business re. crossing sidewalks, and to forthwith cause to be removed or remedied any dangerous conditions existing in this respect."

Crossed unanimously.

Mr. Wilson attended and requested the use of the grounds at Central Park for the Burnaby United Football Club.

Moved by Mr. Langhorne, Seconded by Mr. Gray: - "That this be referred to Mr. Planché with the Clerk and the Clerk, with power to act."

Crossed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Planché, Seconded by Mr. Langhorne: - "That a deputation consisting of Mr. Planché and Smith interview the Board of School Trustees with reference to securing the use of school grounds for playground purposes."

Crossed unanimously.

Mr. Ignace attended and asked what steps have been taken in regard to encroachments on Douglas Road.

Moved by Mr. Gray, Seconded by Mr. Langhorne: - "That the Clerk place the letter from the Corporation Solicitor hereon, before the Council, two weeks hence."

Crossed unanimously.

Moved by Mr. Smith, Seconded by Mr. Planché: - "That this Council do now adjourn."
