

Monday - June 16th. 1930.

A Regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, June 16th, 1930 at 7.30 o'clock p.m.
Present: His Worship Reeve Pritchard in the chair.
Councillors Smith, Shaw, Lambert, Edwards, Wheatley, Shewbrooks and Wilson.

Moved by Cr. Smith, Seconded by Cr. Lambert: "That the minutes of the meeting of June 2nd inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."
Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

Secretary, Moral Division, Social Welfare Council - suggesting that the Burnaby Health By-law be amended in respect to the registration of minors at Auto Camps.

Moved by Cr. Wilson, Seconded by Cr. Lambert: "That this suggestion be referred to the Health Committee for consideration."
Carried unanimously.

Secy. to Board of Police Commissioners - referring matter of Stray Dogs to the Council for consideration as to ways and means of dealing with this nuisance.

Moved by Cr. Wheatley, Seconded by Cr. Lambert: "That this matter be referred to committee of His Worship the Reeve, Cr. Shewbrooks and the Treasurer."
Carried unanimously.

Secretary - Unemployment Conference - forwarding memorandum of proceedings of meeting and requesting the Council to forward to the Provincial Government a concise statement showing the amount expended by the Municipality in relief, specifying the period covered, the different kinds of relief given, with their separate amounts and in the case of relief work the nature of the work.

Secretary, Vancouver, New Westminster and District Building Trades Council - suggesting certain remedies for unemployment situation.

His Worship the Reeve - recommending

- (1) That his action in appointing the Executive of the Public Welfare Council as the committee to act in conjunction with the Municipal Relief officer to consider all phases of the unemployment situation, be approved.
- (2) That his action in making arrangements with the Provincial Dept. of Public Works to have the cordwood on the new highway cut up under the direction of a foreman to be supplied by the Engineer and by relief cases supplied by the Relief officer at the same rate of pay as paid by the Department of Public Works, be confirmed.
- (3) That an appropriation of \$1000.00 per ward be set up to provide relief employment - the work to be arranged between the Engineer and the Councillor for the several wards - the work to be carried out under the supervision of the Engineer and the rate of pay to be the same as that paid by the Department of Public Works.
- (4) That all Municipal work be done on the basis of a five day week with positively no overtime.

Moved by Cr. Smith, Seconded by Cr. Shewbrooks: "That recommendation No. 1. be approved."
Carried unanimously.

Moved by Cr. Lambert, Seconded by Cr. Wheatley: "That the Municipal Relief officer be requested to be in attendance at the North Burnaby Pump house on Tuesdays and Fridays between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12.00 o'clock noon for the purpose of receiving applications for employment from the northern section of the Municipality."
Carried unanimously.

Moved by Cr. Smith, Seconded by Cr. Shaw: "That recommendation No. 2. be confirmed."
Carried unanimously.

Moved by Cr. Smith, Seconded by Cr. Edwards: "That recommendation No. 3. be adopted."

City Clerk - Kamloops - requesting that the following resolutions be endorsed.

Resolved: That the Provincial Government be and is hereby urged to approach the Railway companies with the object of obtaining from them an agreement that pending the amendments of the new section 3a of the Municipal Act. the companies will waive the matter and agree to the tracks being assessed as at present provided and allow the various municipalities to assess and tax the rights-of-way as they have done heretofore.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED "That failing an agreement as above the

Government be and is hereby asked to arrange a Fall session of the Legislature or an early session in the year 1931 in order to amend the enactment before the various assessment rolls are confirmed. AND THAT COPIES of this resolution be forwarded to the Attorney General, the Inspector of Municipalities, the President, the Parliamentary Agent and the Secretary of the Union of B.C. Municipalities, and the Secretary of the Municipal Committee of the Legislature.

The amendment was declared Lost - Reeve Pritchard, Councillors Shaw, Lambert, Edwards, Wheatley and Wilson voting in favour against Councillors Smith and Shewbrooks voting against.

The motion was then put and carried - Crs. Smith and Shewbrooks voting against.

Moved by Cr. Lambert, Seconded by Cr. Wilson: "That the Provincial Government be asked to give a definite reply to the request of this Corporation in the matter of the extension of the Grandview Highway southerly to New Westminster."

Carried unanimously.

Moved by Cr. Wilson, Seconded by Cr. Shewbrooks: "That the Engineer be requested to bring in a report as soon as possible with recommendations as to the Engineering department as a whole."

Carried with Cr. Lambert against.

Moved by Cr. Shewbrooks, Seconded by Cr. Smith: "That the Clerk be instructed to return tenders and cheques to bidders for water pipe."

An amendment was Moved by Cr. Lambert, Seconded by Cr. Shaw: "That the Clerk be instructed to return cheques and tenders when requested so to do by the bidders."

The amendment was declared Negatived - Crs. Edwards, Shewbrooks, Smith and Wheatley voting against.

The motion was then put and declared Negatived - Crs. Wilson, Shaw, Lambert and Reeve Pritchard voting against.

The Council then adjourned until 7.30 o'clock p.m. Monday, June 23rd. 1930.
