

Monday - March 14th, 1932.

An adjourned meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, March 14th, 1932 at 7.30 p.m.  
Present: His Worship Reeve Pritchard in the chair.  
Councillors Martin, Brown, Lambert, Lench, Wheatley, Gray and Hatherly.

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

W.R. Rutledge, M.L.A. - advising that he would do all in his power to have the grants to municipalities maintained on their present basis.  
Moved by Cr. Lambert, Seconded by Cr. Wheatley: "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried unanimously.

1. Chief Engineer, Department of Public Works advising that an extension of time to May 1st, 1932 had been granted for completion of works authorized by agreement No. 46, between Province of B.C. and Corporation of Burnaby under the Unemployment and Farm Relief Act 1931.  
Moved by Cr. Gray, Seconded by Cr. Lench: "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried unanimously.

Minister of Education - forwarding copy of proposed amendments to Public Schools Act.  
Moved by Cr. Lambert, Seconded by Cr. Gray: "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried unanimously.

Turner, Meakin & Co. - requesting information as to the financial standing of the Corporation of the District of Burnaby.  
The Clerk submitted copy of reply to their request as made by the Treasurer.  
Moved by Cr. Martin, Seconded by Cr. Lench: "That the letter be received and filed and that the matter be left to the Clerk to reply."

Carried unanimously.

General Secretary, Burnaby Branch, N.U.W.A. - advising that a delegation would attend the Municipal Hall on Saturday, March 19th inst. to press for answer to their protest against the cutting down on direct relief and also the shutting off of light in the homes of some of the workers, and requesting that as many of the Council as can do so be present to meet the delegation.  
Moved by Cr. Hatherly, Seconded by Cr. Wheatley: "That the letter be received and as many of the Council as can do so be present at the Hall at 11.00 a.m. Saturday, March 19th inst."

Carried unanimously.

Secretary, to Prime Minister - acknowledging receipt of communication re resolutions passed by the Burnaby Ex-Service Men's Unemployment Association re Direct relief, and advising that same had been referred to the Provincial Secretary's Department.  
Moved by Cr. Gray, Seconded by Cr. Lambert: "That the letter be received and filed."

Carried unanimously.

2. City Clerk, Vancouver, forwarding copy of resolution passed by the City Council relative to proposal of Provincial Government to have Municipalities assume cost of Social Services and maintenance of persons in Provincial institutions, setting forth the consequences should such action be taken, and registering a strong protest against any such action.  
Moved by Cr. Wheatley, Seconded by Cr. Lambert: "That the letter be received and that the principal be endorsed by this Council and that similar representations be made to the Provincial Government on behalf of this Municipality."

Carried unanimously.

Secretary, Broadview Ratepayers Association - advising that the meeting of the Broadview Ratepayers Association held on March 10th inst. re Broadview Hall had broken up in disorder, *and that delegation was present should it be desired they be heard.*  
F. Sanders, Sec. pro-tem of the Broadview Ratepayers Association also wrote advising that after the meeting of the Association had broken up a new slate of officers had been elected and had appointed Messrs Engberg, Hall and Ryan ~~had been nominated~~ *as trustees for the Hall.*  
~~and also advising that a delegation was present at the meeting should it be desired they be heard.~~

Moved by Cr. Hatherly, Seconded by Cr. Wheatley: "That the delegation be heard."

Negated - Crs. Brown, Martin, Lench and His Worship the Reeve against.

Moved by Cr. Martin, Seconded by Cr. Lench: "That the letters be received and the parties be notified that this Council does not consider the matter to have been amicably settled and that the Hall remain closed in accordance with former resolutions."  
Carried - Crs. Gray and Hatherly against.

Deputy Provincial Secretary - forwarding copy of circular letter forwarded to Cities and Municipalities re Direct Relief, suggesting that arrangements be made to have all recipients of relief carry out certain work in return therefor. Moved by Cr.Gray, Seconded by Cr.Martin: "That the letter be received and be referred to Unemployment Policy committee for consideration." Carried unanimously.

W.Wright - Acting Secretary - Retail Merchants - advising that a meeting has been called for Thursday, March 17th inst. at 8 o'clock p.m. at Canadian Legion Hall to discuss relief problems and requesting that a representative of the Council be present. Moved by Cr.Gray, Seconded by Cr.Wheatley: "That the invitation be accepted and as many of the Council as can do so attend, and in the meantime the Treasurer be requested to supply each Councillor with information as to amounts received from the Government for Direct Relief, together with statement showing amounts owing to various Retail merchants for goods supplied on relief orders." Carried unanimously.

Chief Probation Officer - forwarding order of the Juvenile Court Judge committing Dorothy Adams and Helen Margaret Adams to the Protestant Childrens Aid Society as a charge against the Municipality of Burnaby. Moved by Cr.Gray, Seconded by Cr.Lambert: "That the order be received and filed." Carried unanimously

The special committee re application of F.Wagner for remission of Trades License fee submitted report advising that the Council have no powers in this regard except the right to amend the Trades license by-law. Moved by Cr.Lambert, Seconded by Cr.Wheatley: "That the report be received and filed." Carried unanimously.

Moved by Cr.Gray, Seconded by Cr.Lench: "That this Council endeavour to amend the Burnaby Trades License By-law to suit present times." Carried - Cr.Hatherly against.

The Relief Officer submitted reports showing number of investigations re Direct Relief and Unemployment relief for period March 7th to 12th inc. as follows:  
Direct Relief 158 Unemployment relief 117

Moved by Cr.Hatherly, Seconded by Cr.Wheatley: "That the reports be received and filed." Carried unanimously.

The Relief Officer submitted report showing disbursements in regard to direct relief for period February 29th to March 5th inst. as \$9,172.70. Moved by Cr.Hatherly, Seconded by Cr.Lambert: "That the report be received." Carried unanimously.

The Committee of the whole submitted report as follows:

Your committee met on Saturday, March 12th, 1932 and recommend:

1. That in future the Relief officer's reports to Council show mileage and calls separately as to Direct Relief and Unemployment relief.
2. That committee reports progress.

Moved by Cr.Lambert, Seconded by Cr.Martin: "That the report be received." Carried unanimously.

1. Moved by Cr.Lambert, Seconded by Cr.Wheatley: "That the Dominion Government and Provincial Government be again requested to assume proportion of cost of carrying out investigations necessary, and that Mr. McGeough be requested to further this application." Carried unanimously.

Moved by Cr.Martin, Seconded by Cr.Gray: "That the Committee of the whole on Relief matters meet at 9.15 a.m. Saturday, March 19th inst." Carried - Crs.Lambert and Hatherly against.

The Clerk submitted report advising that the claim of W.J.Barnes re loss of poultry was in order.

Moved by Cr.Martin, Seconded by Cr.Wheatley: "That the report be received and that Mr.Barnes be authorized to submit claim in amount of \$125.00" Lost - Crs. Brown, Hatherly, Lambert, Gray, and Lench and Reeve

Pritchard voting against.

Moved by Cr.Wheatley, Seconded by Cr.Lambert: "That the Clerk and Treasurer be a committee to determine the value of the poultry lost by Mr.Barnes." Carried - Cr.Martin against.

The Standing Property Committee submitted report on sundry applications as follows:  
(1) K.Edin - Recommendation that applicant be ask for information as to how he proposes to remove wood off D.L.144.

(2) S.J.Steed - Portion of ground applied for has already been granted to another party - Recommendation that balance be referred to Engineer with power to act.

(3) Board of School Trustees - Request further information Lot 14, "D" Blocks 6-8 D.L.96 be reserved from sale pending receipt of information.

(4) F & C Tassell - Recommendation that offer be accepted.

(5) A.D.Paquette - Recommendation that offer of 25 cents per cord for dead and down timber of Lot 1, Plk.22, D.L.13, be accepted.

(6) W.D.Feld - application re Endot Stock yard property - Applicant advised that this property not owned by Corporation.
