

Monday - November 7th. 1932.

An Adjourned meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, November 7th. 1932 at 7.30 p.m.
Present: His Worship Reeve Pritchard
Councillors Martin, Brown, Lambert, Lench, Wheatley, Gray and Hatherly.

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

1. Board of School Trustees - requesting hearing for Trustee Stanley in matter of arrangements for supplying needy school children with hot lunches.
Moved by Cr. Brown, Seconded by Cr. Martin: "That Trustee Stanley be heard."
Carried unanimously.
Trustee Stanley then addressed the Council requesting financial assistance in matter of providing school children with hot lunches, advising that local organizations in and around the various schools were being organized to look after the physical features of the scheme. Equipment necessary was already available at most of the schools but a certain quantity of dishes, hot-plates etc. might be required.
Moved by Cr. Gray, Seconded by Cr. Wheatley: "That the letter be received and the Board be asked to collect such data as to probable requirements and cost thereof and present same to the Council sitting as a committee of the whole at 7.00 p.m. on Monday next."
Carried unanimously.

His Worship the Reeve submitted report advising that at request of the Hon. the Minister of Finance he had in company with the Treasurer attended the Hon. the Minister at Victoria in reference to Direct relief assistance, the results of the interview being as contained in letter from the Deputy Minister of Finance under date November 4th. inst.

2. The Deputy Minister of Finance wrote advising that the Provincial Government will advance this Corporation from the loan made to them by the Federal Government for unemployment relief purposes the amount to cover this Corporation's share of relief for the month of October, and an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 as our share of the costs for the months of November and December. The amount of the loan to be placed to the credit of this Municipality at Victoria, and vouchers for the whole cost of the Corporation share, the Provincial Share and the Federal share when approved will be paid in full.
The Deputy Minister also forwarded form of application for the above mentioned loan with a request that same be completed and be forwarded to Victoria.
Moved by Cr. Wheatley, Seconded by Cr. Lench: "That the letters be received and filed and formal application be made for the loan."
Carried - Cr. Brown against.

Moved by Cr. Lench, Seconded by Cr. Wheatley: "That letter be sent to the Deputy Minister of Finance requesting information as to whether the acceptance of the above mentioned loan of \$32,000.00 will limit the issue of relief for the months of November and December, and further that the Department be asked to advise whether the monies forthcoming under this loan must be used to pay past due accounts or could be used to pay relief in cash in order that work might be obtained from said relief recipients."
Carried unanimously.

3. The Deputy Minister of Finance wrote advising that the total amount advanced to this Corporation on agreement under Unemployment and Farm Relief Act of 1931 amounting to \$108,710.33 with interest \$4,055.03 was now due and requesting that debentures in these amounts be prepared and be forwarded to the Department before the end of the fiscal year.
Moved by Cr. Wheatley, Seconded by Cr. Martin: "That the letter be received and the request be tabled until completion of works authorised by the said agreement."
Carried unanimously.

His Worship the Reeve submitted report advising that on ~~October 31st~~ ^{November 2nd inst.} ~~having a~~ cheque for \$6,267.30 had been received covering Direct relief vouchers for week ending 15th. 1932.

Moved by Cr. Wheatley, Seconded by Cr. Lambert: "That the report be received."
Carried unanimously.

The Relief officer submitted report for week of October 24th to 29th showing total number of cases as 1533 with total expenditure of \$10,048.00
Moved by Cr. Lambert, Seconded by Cr. Hatherly: "That the report be received."
Carried - Crs. Gray, Brown and Martin against.

The Relief Officer submitted report showing number of investigations carried out by Relief Investigators for period Oct. 31st. to Nov. 5th. as 281.
Moved by Cr. Wheatley, Seconded by Cr. Hatherly: "That the report be received."
Carried - Crs. Brown and Gray voting against.

The Relief Officer submitted report as to general conditions advising that for week ending November 5th. 139 relief recipients in South Burnaby had been supplied with partial orders only.
Moved by Cr. Hatherly, Seconded by Cr. Wheatley: "That the report be received."
Carried - Crs. Brown and Gray against.

Moved by Cr.Martin, Seconded by Cr.Lench: "That Commercial crossing agreement T.Charpentier and Burnaby - Lots 19 and 20. Block 1, D.L.68. be signed by the Reeve and the Clerk and that the corporate seal be affixed thereto."

Carried unanimously.

The Relief Officer submitted request for additional assistance at the North Burnaby office, and also for some improvements in equipment and re-arrangement of offices.

Moved by Cr.Hatherly, Seconded by Cr.Wheatley: "That this request be referred to the standing committee on relief for analysis and report."

Carried unanimously.

The President, Vancouver Branch, Amputation Association of the Great War wrote forwarding resolution passed by the Association in convention relative to keeping the 11th day of November as remembrance day.

Moved by Cr.Wheatley, Seconded by Cr.Lambert: "That the resolution be received and acted upon."

Carried unanimously.

Moved by Cr.Wheatley, Seconded by Cr.Hatherly: "That this Council domest as a committee of the whole at the earliest possible moment to go fully into the transportation question and the matter of the B.C.E.R. franchise."

Carried unanimously.

Moved by Cr.Martin, Seconded by Cr.Brown: "That the Provincial Government be requested to widen Kingsway from Boundary Road to B.C.E.R. to eliminate the dangerous condition caused by the widening of the Vancouver portion of Kingsway."

An amendment was

Moved by Cr.GRay, Seconded by Cr.Lench: "That the Provincial Government be requested to widen Kingsway through Burnaby to render the highway safe for traffic and to eliminate the condition caused by the widening of the Vancouver portion of the Highway."

The amendment carried - Crs.Brown and Martin against.

Moved by Cr.Martin, Seconded by Cr.Brown: "That the Provincial Government be asked to immediately take up the widening of Kingsway from Boundary Road to Patterson Avenue in accordance with the suggestions put before the Chief Engineer, Department of Public Works at the meeting on Thursday last."

Moved by Cr.Gray, Seconded by Cr.Hatherly: "That the previous resolution be tabled until a reply is received from the provincial Government to the next preceding resolution."

Carried - Crs.Martin and Brown against.

The Council then adjourned.
