The report further advised that all salaries have been paid to the end of June, but that creditors payments are at present withheld pending the production of a full statement and presentation of our antifipated requirements for the balance of the year to our Bankers. The Treasurer further advised that the return from taxation is inadequate to meet our budgetted expenditures and it will therefore be necessary to obtain credit from our Bankers and his experience during the past few months indicate that the utmost economy will be imperative if we are to have their financial backing.
