

Wednesday - October 11th, 1933.

A Regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, October 11th, 1933 at 10.00 a.m.  
Present: Commissioner John Bennett and the Municipal Clerk.

Ordered: "That the minutes of the sitting of October 4th inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

1. Administrator - Unemployment Relief Branch - Department of Labour - Victoria advising that effective from the 1st August 1933 the District of Burnaby will be re-imburged on a 50-50 basis by the Dominion and Provincial Governments for all Direct Relief expenditures, the cost of administration to be borne by the Municipality.  
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed."

2. Secretary, North Fraser Harbour Board - advising that a meeting of representatives of Municipalities bordering on the North Fraser to discuss the matter of house boat dwellers at 3 o'clock p.m. Thursday, at the City Solicitors Office Vancouver, and requesting that a representative of this Municipality attend.  
Ordered: "That this letter be received and filed and the matter be referred to the Chief Constable."

3. Sec. Wm. Telford Chapt. I.O.D.E. - requesting permission to hold a Tag Day on Saturday, November 4th, at Street corners in North Burnaby and also for permission to place poppies and collect in the schools on November 3rd.  
Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed and the requested permission be granted."

6. The Acting Deputy Municipal Engineer submitted recommendation that B.C.E. R. pole plan K. 8800/1690 covering pole line on Holdom Avenue north of Dundas Street be approved. Poles to be set 10'6" from outside face of pole to property line.  
Ordered: "That the recommendation of the Acting Deputy Municipal Engineer be adopted."

7. Ordered: "That property sales as per sales slip No. 2136 be approved as follows:

Ordered: "That the F.J.Fennings (Capitol Hill) By-law 1933 be now read a third time."

Ordered: "That the F.J.Fennings (Capitol Hill) By-law 1933 do pass the Third reading, that it be signed by the Commissioner and the Clerk and that the Corporate seal be affixed thereto."

Ordered: "That the Commissioner do now sit as a committee of the whole to reconsider Burnaby Land Sale By-law No.6.1933."

Ordered: "That the committee do now rise and report the by-law complete without amendment."

Ordered: "That the Burnaby Land Sale By-law No.6.1933 be now read a third time."

Ordered: "That Burnaby Land Sale By-law No.6.1933 do pass the Third reading, that it be signed by the Commissioner and the Clerk and that the corporate seal be affixed thereto."

The sitting then adjourned.
