

Wednesday - November 8th, 1933.

A regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, November 8th, 1933 at 10.35 P.M.

Present: Commissioner John Mahony and the Municipal Clerk and Deputy Engineer

Ordered: "That the minutes of the sitting of November 1st inst. be adopted as written and confirmed."

The Chief Constable submitted reports on fires as follows:

Ordered: "That these reports be received and filed."

The Deputy Municipal Engineer submitted report on matter of sewer in lane between Oxford Street and Cambridge Street, advising that same had deteriorated to such an extent that residences served by same were in danger of flooding during any heavy rains. He recommended that persons having their roof drains connected to the sewer be requested to disconnect same forthwith and that every effort be made to carry out the work provided for a local improvement construction by-law passed in 1931. Mr. Pedden attended and addressed the Commissioner on this matter contending that the connection of roof drains was not the cause of the flooding, but that the condition of the sewer pipe was such that seepage through same caused the overflow and backing up of the water in the sewer.

Ordered: "That the report be received and the whole matter be again referred to the Engineer for further report and recommendation."

The Deputy Municipal Engineer submitted report on application of W. McCurrach to purchase a Hand Blower now owned by this Corporation and recommended that his proposal be not entertained.

Ordered: "That the report be received and the recommendation of the Engineer be adopted."
