Present: Commissioner H.W.Fraser, Mr.R.Bolton, Dr.W.Sager, and the Clerk.

Ordered: "That the minutes of the sitting of April 25th ultimo be adopted as written and confirmed.

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:

Chief Probation Officer - forwarding order of Juvenile Court Judge Jamieson, committing Mary Pauline Sparling to the care of the Childrens Aid Society with an order against the Municipality of \$4.00 per week.

Ordered: "That the order be received and filed."

Building Inspector - recommending that the previsions of the Burnaby Town Planning By-law be waived to permit Fred.Kirkland to erect a small building on property described as Block A of North part of N.W. D.L.150. to be used as a sales room for flowers, provided the said Fred Kirkland gives the Corporation and undertaking that he will at any time when so requested remove the said building to a position on the property involved in conformity with the provisions of the By-law that may be in force at the time. Ordered: That the recommendation of the Building Inspector be and is hereby adopted

City Clerk, Vancouver - forwarding resolution adopted by the City Council on April 30th ultimo requesting the Corporation of Burnaby to provide suitable access to the City Cemetery Ordered: "That the letter be received and filed and the City be advised that arrangements have been made to have Lonsdale Avenue opened up under the Relief Work programme and also that matter of opening and continuing the Lougheed Highway was under consideration,

Wood, Gundy & Company Limited wrote offering to sell to the Corporation \$1000. District of Burneby 5% Bond due 3ist December 1942, at 64 flat and offering to purchase from the Corporation £500. Province of British Columbia Guaranteed 4% Stock, issued by Pacific Great Eastern Railway due 15th July 1942 at 94 5/8th and interest less tax. The Treasurer recommended the offers beaccepted.

Ordered: "That the offer of Wood Gundy & Coy, to sell to the Corporation \$1000. District of Burnaby 55% Bond due 31st December 1942 at 64 flat be accepted and that the offer of Wood Gundy & Coy, to purchase from the Corporation £500. Province of British Columbia Guaranteed 45% Stock issued by Pacific Great Eastern Eailway due 15th July 1942 at 94 5/8th and interest less tax be accepted and that the Commissioner and the Clerk be and are hereby authorised to sign the Indenture of Transfer and to affix the Corporate seal thereto.

The Treasurer submitted verbal report advising that arrangements have been entered into with the local druggists whereby relief applicants will be able to obtain Medical Aid by application to the various local doctors whose prescriptions will be filled by Local druggists

L.G.Parnell wrote on behalf of the Burnaby United Workers Association advising that the unemployed of Burnaby will not work for a wage that it is impossible to live upon and also demanded the standard rate of wages for any work they are called upon to do and further demand that they be allowed to earn at least \$15.00 per month over and above the amount they now receive as Direct relief.

Donald Currie also wrote forwarding copy of resolution passed by a meeting of 300 residents of Eurnaby held in Culley's Hall, North Eurnaby, to effect that any work done be paid for in cash at the rate of 50¢ per hour and that \$15.00 per month be granted in excess of the Direct relief now granted.

Messrs Parnell, Dobson and Laurie and others addressed the Commissioner on the matter of these two letters. The Commissioner advised that it was not within his power to grant their requests but advised that same would be submitted to the Government at Victoria.
