Ordered: "That the Clerk be and is hereby instructed to take such steps as are necessary to complete the "Furnaby Honour Roll - Great War"."

Ordered: "That General accounts to October 31st.1934. \$1,305.94; Relief Accounts \$7,554.60; Pay Rolls \$ 3,030.61 and Salaries \$5,704.16 be approved for payment,"
