

Wednesday - May 6th. 1936.

A regular sitting of the Commissioner was held at the Municipal Hall on Wednesday, May 6th. 1936. at 10.00 a.m.  
Present: Commissioner Fraser;  
Messrs A.C.Bell, Dr.Wm.Sager, J.G.Mill C.B.Brown, R.Holton, E.L.Rimmer, and W.P.Philps.

Ordered: "That the minutes of the sitting of April 29th ultimo be adopted as written and confirmed."

The Clerk submitted petition received from operators of dry goods stores praying for the enactment of an early closing by-law to close such stores at 7 o'clock p.m. on Saturdays, and advised that as presently signed the petition was not sufficient.

Ordered: "That the petition and report be tabled."

Ordered: "that the recommendation of the Treasurer be and is hereby adopted."

The Treasurer, Secretary School Board and Local Assistant Fire Marshal submitted report on application of the BroadviewRatepayers Assn. for increased fire protection in the Broadview area and advised that as this area is in No.2, Fire Area which is being equipped with new apparatus the service given will be of greater efficiency than heretofore, the Committee were unable to recommend the establishment of a central location with a supply of hose and a reel as requested.

Ordered: "That the report of the committee be received and adopted."

Ordered: "That General accounts to April 30th, 1936 amounting to \$3,599.24; Relief accounts \$6,566.13, Payrolls \$2,136.42 and Salaries account \$3,920.29 be approved for payment."

Ordered: "That the Commissioner do now sit as a committee of the whole to reconsider Burnaby Property Exchange By-law No.1, 1936."

Ordered: "That the Committee do now rise and report the by-law complete without amendment."

Ordered: "That the Burnaby Property Exchange By-law No.1, 1936 be now read a Third time."

Ordered: "That the Burnaby Property Exchange By-law No.1, 1936 do pass the Third reading, that it be signed by the commissioner and the clerk and that the Corporate seal be affixed thereto."

The Requisitions were then examined.

Ordered: "That the Requisitions as submitted be approved."

The sitting then adjourned.
