Robt. Baum / WHEREAS the Corporation of the District of Burnaby is the owner, by virtue of Tax Sale proceedings, of land and premises described as Block 8, D.L. 214. AND WHEREAS the Barnet Lumber Company are the owners of Block 7, D.L. 214. AND WHEREAS the Barnet Lumber Company were originally the owners of the said Block 8. AND WHEREAS the said Barnet Lumber Company obtained access to the said Block 7, D.L. 214 by means of a private road constructed through the said Block 8. AND WHEREAS the said private Road constructed by the Barnet Lumber Company through said Block 8, affords the only means of access to "Barnet" Station on the Canadian Pacific main line.
