A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Wonday, March 26th 1945 at 7:30 p.m.

Present: Reeve Morrison in the Chair, Crs. West, Philps, Reamish, Wilson, Cartlan, Lewis and Ball.

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the Minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written and confirmed.

Carried unanimously.

Correspondence was dealt with as follows:

Secretary, Canadian Legion Post 83, wrote enclosing copy of a resolution padorsed by that body demanding the repatriation of all people of Japanese origin after the war with Japan. Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Wilson: "That the letter be received and filed and acknowledged.

W. A. Kusch wrote submitting subdivision Plan of Lot 9, Block 2, 7.L. 74 S. providing for the establishment of a 10 foot lane at the rear of Lots 1 and 2 and requesting approval of same. Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Ball:

Approval of Same. Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Ball: "That the letter be received and filed and the plan as submitted be not approved and that Vr. Kusch be advised that the lane provided at the rear of Lots 1 and 2 must be continued through to Douglas Foad." Carried unanimously.

H. M. Davenport, Clerk, Haney, B. C., wrote asking the Burnaby Council to endorse the following resolution which has been approved by the Water Committee of the Fraser Valley Municipal Association.

WHEREAS the Municipalities of Burnaby, Delta, Surrey, Langley, Matsqui, Chilliwack, Fitt Meadews, Coquitlam and Maple Fidge, the Cities of New Westminster and Chilliwack and the Village of Abbotsford are in dire need of a sufficient supply of water for domestic and other purposes: AND WHEPEAS the growing populations of these areas is such that the present sources of water are inadequate and tend to increase the danger of contamination: AND WHEREAS THE post war rehabilitation plans for the placing of large numbers of returned men on farms and small holdings will necessitate proper water supply systems: AND WHEREAS it is adv.cated that the de-centralization proper water supply systems: AND WHEREAS it is advocated that the de-centralization of industries is in the best interests of the country but without a good and sufficient supply of water, it is not feasible; AND WHEREAS the Greater Vancouver Water District, through the good offices of their officials, have drawn up a com-prehensive plan for the laying of water mains throughout the aforesaid districts and making available good and wholesome water from their protected sources of supply: AND WHEREAS the estimated cost of laying of the water mains and eraction of tanks is 56,000,000,000 oc: AND WHEREAS the capital cost of the water distributions systems over the areas involved will require all the dunds that municipal financing can raise for such purposes: THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: "That we strongly urge the Provincial and Federal Governments to assume the costs of the laying of the mains of the proposed water supply system plan as outlined by the Greater Vancouver Water District. As a water supply system plan as outlined by the Greater Vancouver Water District, as a Post War Rehauliitation scheme. Moved by Cr. Wilson, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: That the resolution as submitted be endorsed by this Council.

Carried unanimously.

D. Lockwood, Department of Fisheries, wrote advising that he had inspected the proposed site for a garbage dump near Broadway and Eagle Creek and advised that if such a dump is established at this location a serious pollution to the salmon runs would be almost inevitable. Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the letter be received and filed and acknowledged."

Moved by Cr. Beumish, Seconded by Cr. Wilson: "That the resolution authorizing the establishment of a garbage dump on Broadway, east of Melrose. Avenue, be resolnded." Carried unanimously.

Secretary, Lions Club of Burnaby, wrote requesting permission to use the grounds east of the Poyal Oak Hotel on Kingsway from May 50th to June ord inclusive for the purpose of their Club holding a Carnival and also requesting permission to use Confederation Park, North Eurnaby, for the same purpose from June oth to 9th incl. Feamish: "That Burnaby Sewer Fental Fy-law 1945 be now reconsidered." Carried unanimously. Moved by Cr. Gartlan, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: That Burnaby Sewer Rental By-law 1945 be now finally passed and that the Reeve and Clerk be and are hereby authorize to sign and affix the Corporate Seal thereto to sign and affix the Corporate Seal thereto."
