Monday - January 29th, 1945

A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, January 29th, 1945 at 7:30 p.m.

Present: Reeve Morrison in the Chair, Councillors West, Philps, Beamish, Wilson, Gartlan, Lewis and Ball.

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. Wilson: That the Minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written and confirmed. Carried.unanimously.

Correspondence was dealt with as follows:

City Clerk, Vancouver, wrote requesting the Burnaby Council's reconsideration of the resolution respecting the proposed engagement of three experts to examine and report with regard to the B. C. Electric System.

Moved by Cr. Lewis, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the letter be received and filed and that this Council express regret that they cannot see their way to contributing towards the cost of engaging experts."

In Favour: Crs. Lewis and Beamish
Against: Reeve Morrison, Crs. West, Philps, Wilson,
Gartlan and Ball.

Moved by Cr. Ball, Seconded by Cr. Wilson: 'That this Corporation cooperate with other Municipalities and that the resolution as originally suggested be adopted as follows: RESOLVED that the Council of the Municipality of Burnaby goes on record as being in favour of the engagement of three experts of international repute to be employed jointly by the Government of the Province and the various Municipalities served by the B. C. Electric system whose duty it will be to examine the structure and ramifications of the whole group of companies comprising the system and report as to the advisability of making it a publicly owned utility and of suggesting seme practical means of enabling the Province and the Municipalities to join in taking over and operating the system with fairness to both. It is understood that the findings of the experts will not be binding upon any of the Municipalities, and it i estimated that the expense involved insofar as the Municipalities are concerned will not exceed five cents per capita based on the last Dominion census.'

R. W. Robson, Secretary, North Burnaby Ratepayers Association, wrote endorsing the action of the North Burnaby Board of Trade in requesting the installation of a warning light on Hastings Street at Boundary Road.

Moved by Cr. Gartlan, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the letter be received and filed and the writer be advised of action taken by the Council in this matter."

Carried unanimously.

R. W. Robson, Secretary, North Eurnaby Ratepayers Association, wrote requesting action in the matter of the public crossing through D.L. 218.
Woved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: That the letter be received and filed and the matter referred to the Engineer to take up further with the C.P.R. Engineer.

Bob Drummond wrote requesting the installation of showers at Central Park.
Moved by Cr. Lewis, Seconded by Cr. Gartlen: "That the letter be received and filed
and the matter be referred to the Engineer and the Chairman for Estimate of Cost."

Carried unanimously.

Killam and Shakespeare wrote on behalf of their client Mr. R.E. Stewart who occupies a building on Lot 6, Flock 9, D.L. 116 and advised that in their opinion the building situate on this property is the property of Mr. Stewart and that in any event they had advised their client that thirty days notice was required to begiven him to terminate his tenancey. They requested that he be permitted to remove the building on or before
