

Monday - December 19th 1949

An adjourned meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall, Edmonds on Monday, December 19th 1949 at 9:50 A.M.

Present: Reeve Morrison in the Chair, Crs. Philps, Beamish, MacSorley, Gartlan, Stephens and Drummond.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That Cr. J.G. West be granted Leave of Absence from this meeting."

Carried Unanimously

Correspondence was received and dealt with as follows:-

1. Hon. E.C. Carson, Minister of Public Works wrote with reference to proposed meeting re the traffic loop at the intersection of Kingsway and Edmonds Street, advising that as the technical men in his Department were not available to sit in the said meeting, the necessary arrangements had not been made, but that arrangements would be made for the meeting early in the new year.
Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Stephens: "That the communication be received and filed."
Carried Unanimously
2. Greenall Bros. wrote extending appreciation for the cooperation received from the Council and the Engineering Department in connection with their proposed subdivision and housing development on property bordering Marine Drive.
Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the communication be received and filed."
Carried Unanimously
3. City Clerk, City of Vancouver wrote advising a special committee had been appointed by the City Council to consider the duplication of street naming in the City and in Burnaby, suggesting that the Burnaby Council appoint a committee to partake in discussions in this regard.
Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That the communication be received and a Committee be appointed to meet with the Committee of Vancouver City Council to discuss Street Name duplication."
Carried Unanimously
4. Herb Haskins wrote with reference to the 16½ ft. reservation made on Lots 2&3, Blk. 17#50, D.L. 35/151 fronting on Kingsway, advising that it was intended to construct a building on the said property, and requesting information as to the use of this reserved portion.
Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Stephens: "That a committee be appointed to investigate the matter of 16½ ft. reservation on Lots 2&3, Blk. 17/50, D.L. 35/151, and bring down a report thereon."
Carried Unanimously
Committee appointed included Crs. Beamish and MacSorley.
5. General Manager of Transportation, B.C. Electric Rly. Co. wrote advising it was the intention to reduce the service on the Burnaby Lake Interurban Line from half-hourly service to an hourly service between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 p.m., and between the hours of 6:00 P.M. and 11:00 P.M. on weekdays and Saturdays, and on Sundays an hourly service would be operated throughout the day, except during the period 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. when a half hourly service would be provided.
Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Stephens: "That the communication be received and the matter of reduction of service schedule on the Burnaby Lake Interurban Line be referred to the special Transportation Committee for discussion with Company representatives."
Carried Unanimously
6. Secretary, Willingdon Heights Ratepayers Assn. wrote requesting that steps be taken to limit the speed on Willingdon Avenue south from Hastings Street, insofar as traffic was concerned, protesting the excessive speed of heavy traffic which was taking place on this road.
Moved by Cr. Gartlan, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the communication be received, and the matter be referred to the Police Department for attention and that the Association be advised of the general speed limit in force throughout the Municipality."
Carried Unanimously
7. District Engineer wrote submitting copies of correspondence forwarded by the Chief Engineer, Department of Public Works relative to the suggested installation of coloured lights along Kingsway to designate intersected streets along the said highway, and also the matter of height of the telephone cables along the south side of Kingsway, as affecting the proposed installation of ornamental street lighting system on this side of the Highway, said correspondence having been forwarded to the Inspector of Electrical Energy for consideration.
Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Philps: "That a meeting be arranged between representatives of the Department of Public Works and the B.C. Telephone Company regarding the installation of a street lighting system on the south side of Kingsway, and that prior to the said meeting, information be requested from the B.C. Telephone Co. as to the result of the intended survey of the communication line cables of the Company on the south side. Carried Unanimous.

1. District Engineer, Department of Public Works wrote with reference to the traffic problem existing on Kingsway within the Municipality since conversion of the highway to four lanes, advising that the matter was being considered by the Traffic Branch of the Provincial Police with a view to amending the Highway Act to take care of the situation.
Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the communication be received and the Traffic Branch, B.C. Police be requested for information as to what direction it is intended to amend the Highway Act, in this connection."
Carried Unanimously
2. Sales Manager, B.C. Electric Rly. Co. wrote with reference to order placed for five sodium lamps for installation at various points within the Municipality, advising difficulty was being experienced in obtaining the necessary equipment from the factory in eastern Canada, but that it was expected their orders would be filled in the near future.
Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the communication be received."
Carried Unanimously
3. Deputy Minister of Welfare wrote with reference to the proposed new Government plan for dealing with drug services, advising that twelve Municipalities had indicated that either they did not wish to make a decision or are not in favour of the plan, and that in view of the fact that the said Municipalities represented less than 15% of the population in organized territory, it had been decided to put the plan into effect as of 1st January 1950.
Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the letter from the Deputy Minister of Welfare be received and filed."
Carried Unanimously
4. Commissioner, B.C. Police wrote giving details of the policing contract for Burnaby Municipality for 1950 advising that due to increased cost of living bonus and increase in cost of uniforms, charges had been increased to the sum of \$2,663.69 per man, advising that the Burnaby contract had been drawn on the basis of 30 men, being an increase of 4 men, effective as from January 1st 1950, advising further that it was anticipated the upkeep of vehicles for the year 1950 would cost \$19,594.07 based on a car mileage of 227,838 at 8.6 cents per mile; making a total contract figure of \$99,504.77
Moved by Cr. Gartlan, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the letter be received and this matter be referred to the 1950 Council."
Carried Unanimously
5. Secretary, South Burnaby Board of Trade wrote enclosing a copy of a letter forwarded to the Minister of Public Works requesting that quantities of material left on the sidewalk allowance along Kingsway be removed to provide better walking facilities for pedestrians along the said highway. The Board asked that if this was considered a Provincial Responsibility, that a letter of support be forwarded on behalf of the Corporation, to the Minister.
Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the communication be received and the action of the South Burnaby Board of Trade regarding the removal of debris from the Kingsway sidewalk allowance, be endorsed."
Carried Unanimously
6. H.L. Kidd et al wrote complaining of the unfinished state of the boulevard along Patterson Avenue between Hickman's store and Kingsway requesting that steps be taken to replace the parking ramps to those parties where such ramps were in existence prior to the work having been undertaken.
Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the petition be received, and the writer advised cleaning up and levelling of the boulevard was yet to be undertaken, and that it was intended to install a storm drain along this road, which would facilitate parking."
Carried Unanimously
7. S.W. Nelson wrote submitting claim for damages caused when a culvert overflowed at the intersection of Jelta Avenue and Georgia Street, flooding his property necessitating the replacement of 4 yards of top soil, and 3 hours labour required to divert the overflow.
Moved by Cr. Stephens, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the letter be received, and the writer advised the Corporation can admit no liability."
Carried Unanimously
8. Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the Engineer be instructed to look into the matter of improving the condition of the sidewalk allowance on the south side of Kingsway, between Edmonds Street and Britton Street."
Carried Unanimously
9. Moved by Cr. Drummond, Seconded by Cr. Stephens: "That a formal request be made to the B.C. Electric Rly. Co. for a plan of the proposed traffic loop at the intersection of Kingsway and Edmonds Street."
Carried Unanimously
10. Moved by Cr. Drummond, Seconded by Cr. Stephens: "That a formal request be made from Cambridge B.C. Electric Rly. Co. to operate the Capital Hill Bus south on Howard Avenue and west on Dundas Street rather than proceeding from the intersection of Howard and Dundas, west to Grosvenor, thence north to Cambridge, as approved previously."
Carried Unanimously

Social Assistance Administrator submitted recommendation that Mrs. Elsie Williams, Stenographer in the Social Assistance Department, be appointed to the permanent staff effective as from December 27th 1949, and that her salary be increased to \$150.00 per month, in accordance with the existing Agreement with the Civic Employees Union.

3. Special Committee appointed to consider renewal of the footpath over Still Creek in the vicinity of the Lozells area reported having investigated the matter and had formed the opinion the path was necessary even though extensive damage had been done to the cat-walk due to vandalism.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the report be received, and the walk be repaired, and that signs be erected to the effect that should the said walk be damaged further, discontinuation of the walk would be liable to take place."
