## Monday - October 24th 1949

An adjourned meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall, Edmonds on Monday, October 24th 1949 at 9:50 A.M.

Present: Reeve Merrison in the Chair, Crs. West, Philps, Beamish, MacSerley, Gartlan, Stephens and Drummond.

/ Secretary, Eurnaby Hospital Seciety wrete submitting the following resolution for consideration of the Council, advising a delegation would be in attendence to provide further information if required.

RESOLVED: That the Burnaby Hespital Seciety new request that the Burnaby Municipal Council either donate or lease to the Burnaby Hospital Seciety the South Half of Let "A" Sketch 5045, ).L. 68 containing twenty acres, mere or less, to be used for hospital purposes (provided such site is approved by the Provincial Government) and agrees in the event of such site being approved and donated er leased to the Burnaby Hespital Society, to release the three parcels of land which have already been set aside by the Council for hespital purposes.

Delegation appeared

Meved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the delegation be heard."

2 W.T. Willson speke pointing out the necessity of locating the hespital nearer to the Vancouver boundary, advising that the D.L. 68 site had been found suitable, and requested that the site be reserved, leased or donated for hespital purposes. Meved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. West: "That property described South half of Let "A", D.L. 68, Sketch 5045 be reserved for hespital construction purposes." Carried Unanimously

Meved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the Court of Revision of the cotors list commence sittings at 9:30 A.M., Tuesday, Nevember 15th 1949."

His Wership, Reeve Merrison appeinted Crs. Philps and Gartlan as members of the Court, the Reeve's appointment being statutery.

- 3. Delegation representing the North Burnaby Beard of Trade attended and requested an audience with reference to the proposed eff-street transit terminus on East Hastings Street. Moved by Cr. Beamish, Secended by Cr. Gartlan: "That the delegation be heard."
  Mr. Gerald Charlton speke on behalf of the delegation, pointing out that in the epinion of the Beard, the City of Vancouver, in ordering the B.C.E.R. Company te remeve the terminus at Beuniary & Hastings in favour of the off street terminus at Keetenay Street, did not understand the situation insofar as Burnaaby was concerned, further pointing out that the completion of the widening of the 3700 Block East Hastings Street would improve the bettleneck at the Hastings-Boundary intersection. It was suggested that removal of the terminus would be detrimental to commercial values and businesses, and would mean less of revenue to the Municipality through decreased assessments and business licenses. Spekesman urged that the Council go on record as being opposed to the removal of the terminus. Other members of the delegation expressed the opinion that if the terminus were removed, menies spent on widening the 3700 Block East Hastings would be wasted, and further that it was not the interest of the property owners, where the "wyo" was located, as long as the transportation terminus remained at

  Mrs. Ulmer spake requesting improvement of the path through 15th Street to keep children who travel this path from 14th Avenue to Stride Avenue from becoming set during set seather.

Engineer advised it was not practical to maintain these feetpaths unless a proper sidewalk or read is constructed through these areas.

Meved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the matter be referred to the Engineer to report back to the Council at the next memeting of the Council as to what work can be undertaken in this regard."

/ Edward Gwilliam et al wrete requesting that the read allewance between Gilpin Street and Percival Street be cleared to allew passage for residents of the district, and particularly children attending Douglas Read School. Secretary, Central Burnaby Ratepayers & Citizens Assn. wrete endersing the petition of the residents. Delegation appeared.

Meved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Drummend: "That the delegation be heard."

Mr. Cowan presented the residents petitien and speke in support of the petitien Engineer advised verbally that it was possible for the Board of Works Department to undertake this work without difficulty.

Meved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Drummend: "That the Engineer be instructed to clear out the path as requested by the Gilpin Street residents." Carried Unanimously

J. Cameron et al wrete resquesting that the lane immediately south of the 4100 Block East Hastings Street be improved by constructing drains to prevent everflow of drainage from the lane onto private property. Mr. Cameron appeared and requested an interview.

Meved by Cr. Philps, Secended by Cr. Gartlan: "That the delegation be thanked and the matter be referred to the Engineer for discussion with the Bricklayers Asseciation.
