

Monday - November 28th 1949

A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall, Edmonds on Monday, November 28th 1949 at 9:40 A.M.

Present: Reeve Morrison in the Chair, Crs. West, Philips, Beamish, MacSorley, Gartlan, Stephens and Drummond.

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Stephens: "That minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written, and confirmed."

Carried Unanimously

1. E.E. Winch, Hon. Secretary-Treasurer, New Vista Society wrote advising the Society was desirous of erecting a number of low rental cottages for elderly women pensioners, making application to purchase Lots 9 to 13 incl. Block 13, D.L. 30 for this purpose, and further requesting that the lots be converted into acreage, prior to sale to the society.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the application to purchase be granted but that the writer be informed conversion of the property into acreage cannot be entertained."

Carried Unanimously

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the application of the New Vista Society to purchase property in D.L. 30 be referred to a Committee for consideration and report."

Carried Unanimously

Committee appointed included His Worship, Reeve Morrison, Chairman of the Property Committee (Cr. Gartlan) and the Property Manager.

2. Thomas Farrington submitted rough sketch of property subdivision located on Bond Street, showing 10 lots each with 48 ft. frontage, and provision of a lane for all except two lots, pointing out that this new subdivision will enlarge the frontage from that of the former subdivision which was 41' per lot.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the application of Thomas Farrington for approval of subdivision of Bond Street property, be approved."

Carried Unanimously

3. Messrs Bell & Munn wrote with reference to Esmond Lumber Co. v Sokar Enterprises and Corporation of Burnaby advising that they had been in contact with Mr. Sokar and that it was understood his solicitor would be contacting the Corporation to pay off the balance of the purchase money due the Corporation under the sale and purchase agreement dated 19th October 1948 and that further, the solicitor for the Esmond Lumber Co. was pressing for payment of the claim therein amounting to \$112.94 and that if the Corporation paid such amount, his clients would assign to the Corporation all rights and claim against the defendants. Bell & Munn advised they were of the opinion the Corporation in foreclosure proceedings pursuant to the Municipal Act and under the sale and purchase agreement dated 19th October 1948 could not add to the installments moneys paid to discharge a mechanic's lien, but that it was the opinion that by taking an assignment of the Esmond Lumber Company, rights the Corporation would be able to enforce repayment of the amount by the Sokar Enterprises Limited, in addition to the unpaid installments under the sale and purchase agreement.

Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the letter be received, and this matter be tabled for a period of one week."

Carried Unanimously

4. L.J. Bateman, Monterey Furniture wrote with reference to recent decision made by Magistrate Grant pursuant to the Anti Noise By-law as affecting the operation of his furniture factory, submitting that the said By-law, having been drafted in very general terms, was a detriment to all businesses within the Municipality, and recommending that the By-law be amended to protect Industries operating under License within Burnaby.

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Stephens: "That the letter be received, and referred to a committee of the Solicitor and the Reeve for enquiry and report to the next meeting of the Council."

Carried Unanimously

5. Chief Engineer, Department of Public Works, wrote advising the Department was considering the improvement of the Hastings-Barnet Road from Sperling Avenue, easterly to Arden Avenue, requesting that Corporation owned property which would be affected by the proposed improvement be reserved, and advising that completion of the proposal would be undertaken as quickly as possible.

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the letter be received, and the Corporation own property between Sperling Avenue and Arden Avenue which would be affected by the proposed improvement by the Department of Public Works of the Hastings-Barnet Road, be temporarily reserved."

Carried Unanimously

6. Assistant Solicitor, B.C. Electric Company Ltd. wrote advising that pursuant to Section 7 of the B.C. Electric Power & Gas Company Ltd. Act, 1927 notices respecting the taking over by the British Columbia Electric Company Limited of the following following Companies, would appear in the B.C. Gazette issue dated 24th November 1949.

1. President, Broadview Social & Service Club wrote with reference to a recent application by the Club and the Schou Street School P.T.A. for the construction of sidewalks along the Grandview Highway in the vicinity of the Schou Street School advising that a joint delegation would be in attendance at the next meeting of the Council to further discuss this matter.  
Delegation appeared.  
Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Drummond: "That the delegation be heard."  
Carried Unanimously  
Spokesman for the delegation spoke pointing out the immediate necessity for provision of a sidewalk on the Grandview Highway in the vicinity of Schou Street School, particularly in the interests of safety to school children, pointing out the hazard emanating from the heavy traffic which uses this highway, and requesting that steps be taken without delay to remedy the condition.  
Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the Engineer be instructed to bring down an estimate of the cost of a gravel sidewalk on the north side of Grandview Highway, from Boundary Road to Willington Avenue."  
Carried Unanimously
2. Secretary-Treasurer, Burnaby School Board wrote with reference to sum of \$800.00 held in trust by the Municipal Treasurer, being an amount realized from the sale of an old dwelling located at 2944 Clinton Street, advising authority had been obtained from the Council of Public Instruction to use this money, and requesting the approval of the Municipal Council to expend the monies for the improvement of the playing field of the Burnaby South High School.  
Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That permission as requested by the School Board, be granted."  
Carried Unanimously
3. Secretary, Burnaby Town Planning Commission wrote with reference to application of L.E. Sanders for an extension of the Commercial zone on Imperial Street to include property described Lot "B", Block 3, J.L. 99, advising that in the opinion of the Commission the commercial zone already established on Imperial Street between Maple and Gray Avenues was sufficient to meet the needs of the district, and that the Commission did not favourably entertain the application.  
Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the letter be received and be concurred in, and the applicant be so notified."  
Carried Unanimously
4. Premier, Province of British Columbia wrote advising it was the Government's intention to introduce legislation at the forthcoming session of the Provincial Legislature to make it possible for the Province to enter into agreement with the dominion to embark on a programme of house construction, and that since a Municipal Responsibility enters into the arrangements, the Government wished to arrange a meeting of mayors and Reeves of Burnaby and other Municipalities of the Fraser Valley to be held in the Executive Council Chambers on December 13th 1949.  
Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the Reeve, Engineer and Property Manager be delegated to attend the Dominion-Provincial Housing meeting on December 13th, and to report thereon."  
Carried Unanimously
5. Treasurer submitted recommendation that Miss Ivileen Hogben be confirmed in her position as Stenographer, Treasurer's Department, on completion of her six month probationary period.  
Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the recommendation of the Treasurer be adopted."  
Carried Unanimously
6. Treasurer submitted recommendation that E.A. Fountain, 910 Jefferson Road, Murrayville be appointed to the position of License Inspector, for the usual probationary period of six months.  
Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. Philips: "That the recommendation of the Treasurer be adopted."  
Carried Unanimously
7. Deer Lake Improvement Committee submitted a statement of receipts and disbursements accruing from contributions collected by their committee, toward the development of Deer Lake Park.  
Moved by Cr. Stephens, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the letter be received, and Mr. G.R. Rae be forwarded letter of appreciation."  
Carried Unanimously
8. Mrs. Claire Custance wrote drawing attention to an old dilapidated barn located on the late Mr. Welsh's property south of Kingsway at Britton Street, requesting that steps be taken to have the building demolished and that action also be taken to curb the speeding of trucks off Kingsway onto Britton Street.  
Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. West: "That the letter be received and these matters be referred to the Building Inspector, Sanitary Inspector and Engineer."  
Carried Unanimously

1. J. Vipani wrote with reference to water service to his properties in the the vicinity of Hurst Street and McKay Avenue, advising he could see no reason why he would not be allowed to connect to a 3/4" main presently in existence rather than install a 6" main on McKay from Hurst Street, in view of the permission granted other residents in the area to connect to 2" mains. Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the letter be received, and referred to the Chairman, Waterworks & Social Assistance Committee for investigation and report."

Carried Unanimously

2. Moved by Cr. Stephens, Seconded by Cr. Gartlan: "That the B.C. Electric Railway Co. be requested to transfer their bus loading zone in North Burnaby from the present location on Boundary Road north of Hastings Street, to the south side of Hastings Street immediately east of Boundary Road."

Carried MacFarland Drummond against.

3. Moved by Cr. Beamish, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the Provincial Government be approached with the suggestion that the colour of the globes used in lighting standards along Kingsway at intersections of sideroads, be changed to a suitable colour to denote the existence of the said intersections."

Carried Unanimously

Moved by Cr. Drummond, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the Council sponsor stewardship meetings to be held at various points throughout the Municipality."

Motion Lost - In favour - Crs. Beamish and Drummond.

Against - Crs. West, Philips, MacSorley, Gartlan, Stephen and the Reeve.

4. Special Committee appointed to consider the application of A.I. Miles for permission to install a 500 gallon underground gasoline storage tank, and storage pump on property at 3850 Hazel Street, recommended that as this location was in a residential area, and the proposed pump and tank was to be utilized for the servicing of taxicabs operated by the applicant, the permit be not granted. Moved by Cr. Gartlan, Seconded by Cr. Stephens: "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted."

Carried Unanimously

5. Standing Auto Camp Committee reported on the application of Dr. M.H. Coupe for approval of Lot "A", Block 6, D.L. 748 $\frac{1}{2}$  as an auto camp site, advising that since an auto camp had been in existence on the property for considerable time, and since the area of the property was sufficient, and was of suitable contour, the property was considered a suitable site for an auto camp. Dr. Coupe attended and spoke advising it was the intention to reconstruct the existing cabins and make additions thereto, in order to improve the property. Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That approval of property described Lot "A", Block 6, D.L. 748 $\frac{1}{2}$  be granted."

6. Standing Auto Camp Committee submitted report on application of United Church of Canada for approval of construction of a Senior Citizens Housing Project on property described Block "B", D.L. 149, advising the area consists of 232,106 square feet, which area would be required to accommodate twenty duplex dwellings and seven single dwellings plus an administration building, 50x80 with provision for future additions, further advising that the plans submitted for construction and general layout complied with the Building By-laws, but that additional information was required with respect to the location of septic tanks and rock pits. Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. Beamish: "That the report be received and accepted, and permission for the project be granted to the United Church of Canada on condition that the necessary information relative to the drainage system is first provided."

MacSorley: "That the Provincial Department of Public Works be requested to mark Kingsway Highway upon its entrance to Burnaby, with suitable wording to direct traffic to use the outside lane of the highway, except when passing other vehicles, in order to halt the infringement of the Provincial regulations with regard to passing on the right hand side."

Carried - Reeve Morrison voting against.

Requisitions were then examined.

Moved by Cr. Philips, Seconded by Cr. West: "That requisitions as submitted be approved."

Carried Unanimously

Special Committee appointed to consider the establishment of parking regulations on East Hastings Street submitted recommendation that a one hour parking limitation be imposed along East Hastings Street between Boundary Road and Wellington Avenue on the south side, between the hours of 9 A.M. to 6 P.M.

Moved by Cr. West, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted."

Carried Unanimously

Special Committee appointed to consider application of B.C. Electric Ry. Co. for establishment of bus loading zones on Hastings Street East, submitted recommendation that the Street Traffic Regulation By-law be amended to establish such zones on East Hastings Street at the following points:

South side of Hastings Street, west of Ingleton, MacDonald & Carleton Ave.

South side of Hastings Street, east of Gilmore Avenue.

Moved by Cr. Drummond, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That report of the Committee be adopted."

Carried Unanimously
