Mr. Hicks advised that the cost in former years amounted to approximately \$600.00 Ami that this year the same amount was planned to expend on a programme to take place on Hallowe'en night between 6:50 and 10:30 P. M., when it was planned to distribute some two thousand bags of candy and apples etc., to an expected crowd in the neighborhood of six thousand. Mr. Hicks advised that member organizations were contributing towards the cost of this celebration and requested a grant from the Council towards this affair, advising that it was planned to expend \$400.00 of the total estimate on fire works, and suggested that half this sum be lonated by the Cosporation. The speaker pointed out that this celebration was open to all residents of the Municipality.

The delegation was advised that there is no power in the "MunicipalAct" for the Wouncil to donate public funds towards entertainment of this nature."
