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Monday - May 22nd 1950

A regular meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall, Edmonis or Monday, May 22nd 1950 at 7:30 P.M.

Present: Reeve Beamish in the Chair, Crs. Wilks, Philps, MacSorley, Armstrong, Stephens and Drummond.

/ Public Hearing convened to hear opinions with regard to amundments as proposed to the Burnaby Town Planning By-law 1948.

E. & M. Buckley-Beevers wrote at the request of residents in the vicinity of Petterson Avenue and Imperial Street, protesting the proposed spot re-zoning of Lot 9, Block 47, D.L. 151/3 to "Local Commercial" requesting that this property be retained as a "Residential" zone. E. Coldicutt spoke as a representative of the ratepayers in the vicinity of Patterson Avenue and Imperial Street protesting the re-zoning of Lot 9, Block 47, D.L. 151/3, on the gounds that the re-zoning of the property to "Local Commercial" would be detrimental to surrounding property, and questioned the merit of allowing stores to locate in this area, advising the residents had been very patient with the noisy operation of the Burnaby Monumental Works, which operates on the property at the present time, advising further that the said works were very unsightly.

Wm. S. McRae spoke with reference to the proposed re-zoning of property south of Rumble Street on the east side of Sussex Avenue to Southwood Street, to a depth of 130 feet, said property to be re-zone to "Local Commercial", presenting a petition representing residents in the vicinity protesting the proposed re-zoning for reasons that (1) the area was furnished with adducate services from established local stores, (2) further services were provided by shopping areas at McKay & Jubilee, (3) additional stores would lead to "business suicide"(4) southern slope considered to be poor commercial location, and should be utilized as residential property (5) detrimental to adjacent property (6) assurances received from officials, property strictly residential (7) present four lots to the north, ample commercial expansion.

S.T.Evans spoke concurring in the remarks of the speaker. John G. McDonald appeared and spoke on behalf of resident taxpayers, and presented a brief in protest of the proposed rezoning of the property between Rumble and Southwood, east of Susser.
