Moved by Cr. Isherwood; seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the "Burnaby Land Sale By-law No. 12, 1950" be now finally adopted, that it be signed by the Reeve and Clerk, and the corporate seal be affixed thereto."

Fevel by Cr. Philps; seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the requisitions be passed.

Carried Unanimously

Mr. Kliman attended and requested permission to address the Council in connection with the application of Mr. G. A. Underhill for the re-zoning of Lot A. Block 77. District Lot 123 and 124. After some discussion it was moved by Cr. Philps; seconded by Cr. MacSorley; That Mr. Kliman be heard.

Carried Unanimously

Mr. Kliman then addressed the Council, requesting that Mr. MacRae, an employee of the Standard 011 Company be given an opportunity to give evidence on the subject matter.
