Present: Reeve Beamish in the Chair, Crs. Wilks, MacSorley, Drummoni, Philps, Armstrong, Stephens and Isherwood.

Special Committee appointed to consider applications for the position of Building Inspector, submitted recommendation that Mr. E.L.King be appointed to the pesition. Moved by Cr. Stephens, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted.

Carried Unanimously

Meved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Isherwood: "That authority beigranted to execute Agreement between the Corporation of Burnaby and L. and W.J.Greenall respecting subdivision of lands in D.L. 175, that the document be signed by the Reeve and Clerk and the Cerperate Seal be affixed therete." Carried Unanimously

Meved by Cr. MacSerley, Seconded by Cr. Isherwood: "That Burnaby Land Sale By-law No. 3, 1950 be new reconsidered."

Meved by Cr. MacSerley, Seconded by Cr. Isherwood: "That Burnaby Land Sale By-law No. 3, 1950 be now finally adepted, that it be signed by the Reeve and Clerk, and the Cerperate Seal be affixed thereto." Carried Hcr. Philps voting against.

- Belegation appeared in connection with reduction in service by the B.C.Electric May cor, on the Burnaby Lake Interurban Line, and requested an audience. Meved by Cr. Stephens, Seconded by Cr. Drummend: "That the Delegation be heard." Carried Unanimously
- 2. Spekesman for the Breadview District speke en behalf of residents south of the Lougheed Highway, and north of the Grandview Highway, advising the residents in this area were required to walk one-half mile to the nearest transportation, with a service of one hour and twenty minutes. Spekesman further pointed out that there are no north-south control of the service and the service of the s there was no north-south service for this area, and that a ene mile walk was necessary to the Beundary Read service.
- 3. Mr. Salisbury attended as representative of the Central Burnaby Ratepayers & Citizens Association registering the Associations opposition to the reduction in service on the Burnaby Lake line. Mr. Salisbury presented a petition through Cr. Armstrong, containing approximately 1120 names of persons affected by the Service reduction, savising that the said petition was not being presented through the Association, but that the membership considered the move to be a betrograde step in the development of the community. Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Isherweed: "That the information and mattitude presented be passived and and and the the the information and petitien presented be received and referred to the standing Transpertation Committee for future study and discussion with B.C.E.R. Company efficials."
